portraiture. More than this, figures and factors, based in every case upon actual experiment, have been worked out for all the principal films and plates on the market, and reli- able data collected in a most conven- ient form.

By this means and with the aid of the excellent "Wellcome" Exposure Calculator attached to the cover, it is possible to secure correct exposures under all circumstances, by a single turn of the dial.

Plenty of space is left for diary pages and exposure notes, and the book is provided with pencil and clasp, so that it does double duty as a pocket note book and work of refer- ence, and is equally useful in the dark room and the field.

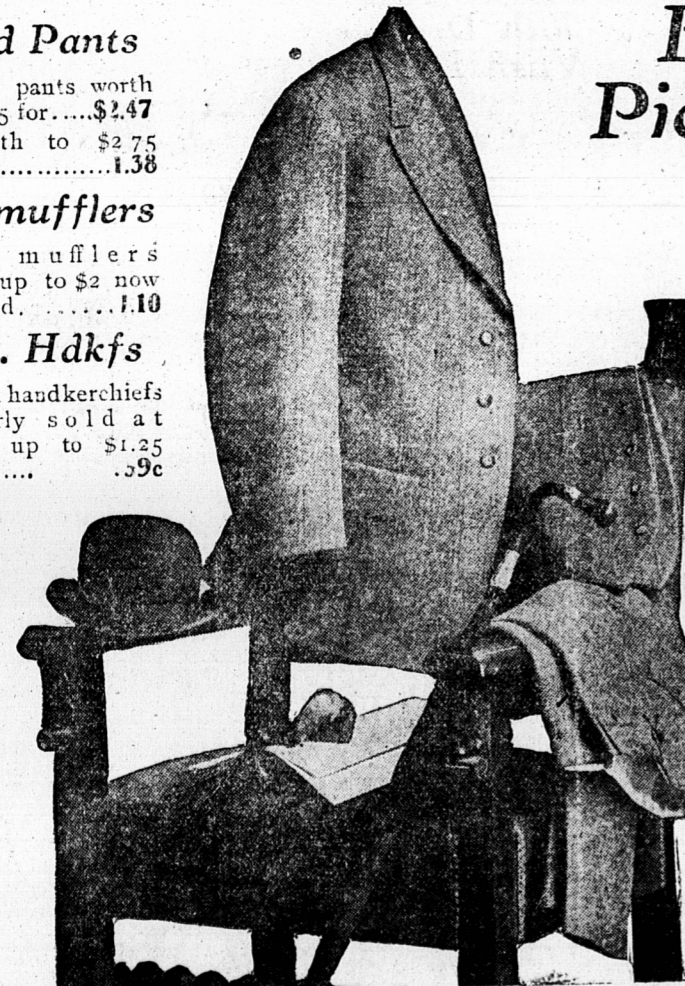
