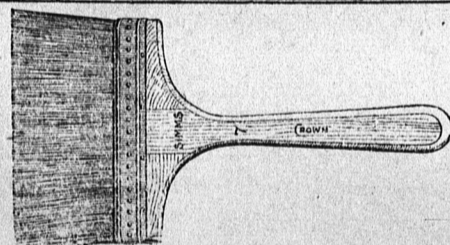
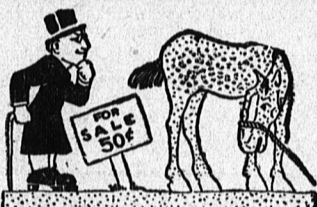

OTTAWA, May 10—The Mounted Police headquarters have received a report from Inspector Phillips at Fort McPherson at the mouth of the MacKenzie River on the Arctic Ocean. The report is dated February. The police have been scouring the Arctic for a trace of Stefansson, but have been unable to get any word of him. The police report, however, that the southern expedition which was headed by Dr. Anderson was wintering on Coronation Gulf. All the party were well. Two boats were with the party, North Star and Alaska. Another boat, Mary Sachs was sent north to search for Stefansson and to leave caches for him. This boat wintered on Baffins Land.

FRIEND OF LINCOLN WAS BISHOP TURNER.

WINDSOR, May 9—Henry McNeal Turner, Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Michigan from a stroke of paralysis in Hotel Diet here yesterday. Bishop Turner, who was eighty-three years old, was found on the docks near the Customs House about noon Saturday in a dazed condition and was removed to the hospital. He died shortly afterwards.

An associate of Abraham Lincoln and Fred Douglass, Bishop Turner, early showed ability for beyond his station in life. He was the first colored Chaplain in the United States army, appointed by President Lincoln. After the Civil War he aided in the education of his race, and in late years was a close friend of Booker T. Washington. He was at one time a member of the Georgia Legislature.

PARIS ASSISTS ITS NEEDY ARTISTS.

PARIS, May 10—The world famous gardens of the Palais Royal have been placed at the disposal of the hundreds of Parisian artists whom the war has reduced to the verge of starvation.

At a little restaurant pavilion in the centre of the gardens, built by Cardinal Richelieu in 1613, and which during the succeeding two centuries witnessed some of the gayest scenes of French court life, the artist will hereafter dine at 10 cents a head. The menu at this price will include fillet of beef with mushrooms, new potatoes, cheese, rice, cake, wine, coffee and liquors.

Of all the classes, occupations and professions hard hit by the war few have suffered more than the artists and sculptors. Not one of them has sold a picture or a statue since the war began. With starvation actually staring the artists in the face, their case was finally taken up with the government by the children of Henri Boulhet, former vice-president of the Central Union of Decorative Arts. The Minister of Fine Arts placed the gardens at the Royal Palace at his disposal, and there in the former royal pavilion the ten-cent restaurant has just been opened.

The first meal served was partaken of not only by about 100 artists, but by the Minister of Fine Arts and official representatives of the Salon of French Artists, the National Society of Fine Arts, the Autumn Salon, and the National School and Union of Decorative Arts.

LONDON, May 10—The authorities of the Baltic Exchange and of the Mark Lane wheat market have suspended until further notice all German, Austrian and Turkish up to the

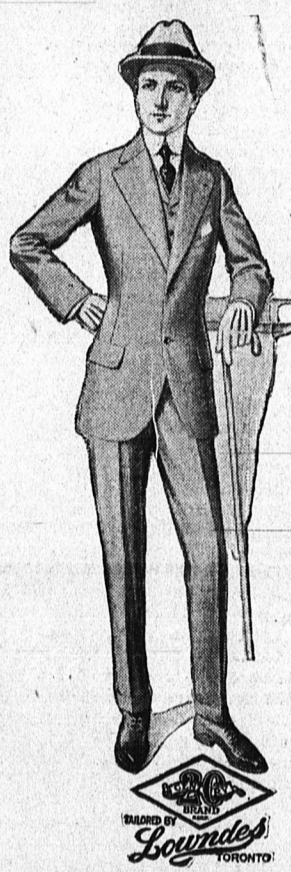
age of 60, with the exception of those having service at the front in the British ranks.
