TRYING TO SETTLE ULSTER PROBLEMS

(Canadian Press). LONDON, July 17.—The Government is making strong efforts to reach a settlement of the Ulster problem. Two cabinet councils were held yesterday. Premier Asquith had an audience with the king and communi-

cation with Andrew Bonar Law, Unionist Leader and Sir Edward Carson. The whole day was occupied with conferences between the various party leaders without a definite result. The negotiations will be continued Monday and it is understood the prospects for an agreement are improved.

FARMERS' PICNIC NORTH WILTSHIRE

At the farm of Mr. Wm. Clark at Maple Grove, North Wiltshire, on Saturday a very pleasant afternoon was spent, a number of farmers from the neighborhood and a party from Charlottetown being present. McLean, M. P., and Mr. J. K. McInnis, of Regina, formerly of Prince Edward Island—passed the afternoon in Mr. Clark's house, where they were served with tea, cake, sandwiches and other delectable sweetmeats by the genial and hospitable members of the family. Mr. Clark exhibited some of his excellent herd of cattle, a particularly attractive feature of which was a massive and imposing two-year-old bull. The cattle, and also a splendid draught horse of over 1,600 lbs. and a fine flock of Plymouth Rock hens, were all photographed by Mr. F. A. Benson. Mr. Clark deserves the complimentary remarks which were heaped upon him for the clean, sanitary condition of his stables and the picturesque of his fields. TERRIFIC STORM IN NEW BRUNSWICK

(Special to The Guardian) ST. JOHN, July 19.—The worst electrical storm in the last decade hit the head of Millstream, above Apohaqui, Saturday morning, accompanied by a cloudburst. Over Mountains Keirstead and Snider the water rolled down in vast billows doing about two hundred dollars damage, swept a million feet of logs away, destroyed highway bridges and roads, carried out piers, dams and booms.
