**BIG ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD AT OTTAWA**

NIAGARA FALLS, Ontario, July 21.—As a result of a debate on the unemployment at the session of the Executive of the Canadian Union of Municipalities held here, and in view of the adoption of Mr. Liebthal's resolution calling upon the municipalities to report committees, a big round table conference will be called at Ottawa over which members of the Dominion Cabinet will be asked to preside. The duty of the local conditions and needs and prepare plans which can be adopted to meet these local conditions. Every municipality will be expected to take care of its own unemployed temporarily. The first plan is to prevent the cities being made the dumping grounds of the surrounding rural communities.

Messrs. W. D. Lighthall, and G. S. Wilson, and Alderman Boyd, of Montreal, Alderman Merley Wickett, of Toronto; Mayor Walters, of Hamilton, Mayor Stevenson of London; Mayor Waugh, of Winnipeg, and a few others will be in charge of the preliminary plans.

### THE ALLIED NATIONS DETERMINED TO WIN


PARIS, July 23.—One year ago today the Austrian ultimatum to Serbia which led up to the war was delivered. The French press commemorates the anniversary with articles voicing the resolution of France and her allies to carry off the war unswervingly. The "Matin" says:—"Germany had reached the point of wishing to crush by diplomacy, if not by force, nations unwilling to accept her yoke. She was completely carried away by the desire of domination as well as the mania, which led her to believe she could not exist without uncontested superiority in Europe.

Alfred Capus, the dramatist writes in the "Figaro":—"France did not show the least hesitation, the least doubt about the danger which menaced her, nor in regard to the enemy's design. Rarely has a nation had more prompt or clear vision of her destiny. In a few hours she took stock of herself, accepted the German challenge and swore to conquer."

### 500 VOLUNTEERS IN 2 DAYS AT TORONTO

TORONTO, July 20.—The wave of military ardor has reached fever heat. Men are recruiting faster than the officers and medical staffs can handle them. The figures gathered from numerous stations show that nearly 500 men have volunteered in two days. Every park and many wide avenues are used to make up for lack of space in and around the armories.

### LUSITANIA FAREWELL ASHORE IN BOTTLE

AMSTERDAM, July 23.—On Saturday near the village of Koudekerke, a bottle was washed ashore containing a sheet of paper on which these words were written:—"Lusitania. We are torpedoed, one in front and one in back. I take leave of my parents and my girl, who live in London. John Street, 57 East End. He who finds this is begged to give this to them. The boat sinks. Farewell forever."

J. H. BURTON, The name of J. H. Burton does not appear in the published lists of the passengers and crew of the Lusitania; but these lists, it is known, are not entirely complete.

### MORE LONGSHOREMEN JOIN THE STRIKERS IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, July 22.—The ranks of the striking longshoremen on the piers of the Clyde and Mallory lines were increased today by about 500 men, making about 1,400 men idle on the North River waterfront. The strike began yesterday as a protest against the wages the men were receiving and their leaders said today that efforts would be made to call out longshoremen employed by other lines. In that event there might be a serious delay in the shipment from this port of foodstuffs and war supplies to Europe.

Officials of the two lines at present involved said today that they had succeeded in filling the places of about 1,000 of the strikers and that business at the piers was going on practically as usual.

### 2,000 ITALIAN VOLUNTEERS FROM AMERICA REACH NAPLES

NAPLES, July 22.—Two thousand Italian volunteers from the United States were landed here today and received a great ovation. Headed by bands, they marched in procession through the principal streets, carrying the American and Italian flags.
