Price of Hogs

Sir,—Does it pay best to sell hogs alive or dressed weight? This question has often been debated by farmers and it is generally agreed that the majority prefer to do their own killing, claiming that they get better prices. It has been found that when live hogs require to be shipped any great distance there is a heavy shrinkage (which is avoided when killing on the farm), besides there is usually quite a number of bruised as well as an occasional dead hog, which loss must be reckoned when making prices to farmers.

What is Wrong?

Sir,—Some time ago I noticed a letter in the Guardian signed by J. D. McIntyre expressing his views on conditions in P. E. I. One or two writers have since criticized his letter, but in my opinion J. 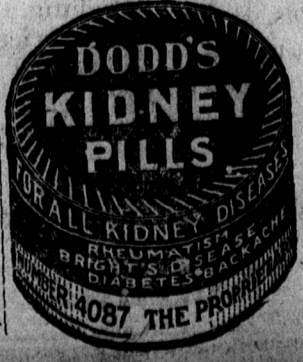

Praise Showered On Italy's Leader

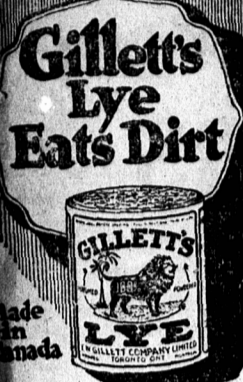
