Jennings of Saint John, N.B., director of army public relations for the last two years, will retire to civilian status shortly at his own request and will become director of public relations and advertising for War Assets Corp., Defence Headquarters announced today.

Col. Jennings will be stationed in Montreal and will succeed G. H. Lash, who has been recalled by Canadian National Railways, from which he has been loaned to War Assets Corp.

Member of a well-known Maritime family, Col. Jennings was editor-in-chief of the Saint John Telegraph-Journal before he came to Defence Headquarters in February, 1943, as chief public relations officer with rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. He was appointed director in June, 1943, and was promoted to full Colonel last July.

He also leaves two sons, Kenneth and Richard; his parents Mr. and Mrs. Edwin B. Myers, 151 1st St., South Boston; two sisters, Emma E. (MacLeod) 151 Dorchester St., South Boston; Mae D. (Robbins), Charlottetown, P. E. I., Canada; seven brothers, Walter, N. Arthur, T. Clarence E. of Cardigan, P. E. I., CPO Royal Canadian Navy; Stanley F., veteran of 2 1/2 years' overseas service with the 2nd "Hell on Wheels" Armoured Division; Vernon L., 70th MP Battalion, and Warren C., overseas with a cavalry regiment.
