JAZZ MUSIC SURFEIT IN CHURCHES ALLEGED Boston Methodist Preacher Would Jail Publishers.

HAMILTON, Ont., June 8.—Prof. Augustine Smith, of Boston, Mass., addressing the Hamilton Methodist Conference here on Saturday said:—

"There is altogether too much jazz music in the churches of today."

Prof. Smith added that, many music publishers should be jailed. A revival of spiritual music was needed in the churches, he said.

Rev. George W. Barker, secretary of the Methodist Mission Board, stated that unless a deficit of \$100,000 was made up in the mission funds many missionaries would have to be withdrawn from foreign fields. Many members of Methodist churches were driving motor cars, he said, who never gave a cent to missions.

FOUR MASTED VESEEL LOST

POSTON, June 8.—Word has been received here of the loss of the four-masted schooner Laura A. Barnes, bound from New York for Norfolk, Capt. Charles H. Barnes, the commander and part owner, and his crew were saved. The Barnes registered 629 tons and was built at Camden (Me.) in 1918.

OUR NATIONAL ANTHEM.

Our popular National Anthem, "God Save the King" was first introduced in 1740 to celebrate the capture of Puerto Bello, South America, by Vernon. The air was very similar to the present time, and so popular was it that the French eventually adopted it in 1776, and it has also been used as the Danish, Prussian, German, and American national tune. The words and music of the "Marseillaise" were composed as far back as 1792 by a soldier—Rouget de Lisle—a captain of Engineers, stationed at Strasbourg. More than one lay claim to having composed the piece, however. About the middle of that year he was sent at a civic banquet at Marseilles with such effect that it was immediately printed and distributed to the volunteers of the battalion just then starting for Paris. They were singing their new hymn when they entered Paris, and again as they marched to the attack on the Tuilleries on August 10, 1792. From that day the "War Song for the Army of the Rhine" as it was originally called, became known as the "Marseillaise."
