BRITONS WOULD NOT EXTERMINATE GERMAN PEOPLE

Sicilian Naval Party Back Home

HALIFAX, Oct. 27 (CP) - Their part played in the conquest of one continent and the groundwork laid for liberation of another, five Royal Canadian Navy officers and 40 ratings of one of the first Canadian landing craft flotillas, which "tough down" on Sicily's shores arrived here recently on their way home for well-earned leave. The flotilla cut its fighting teeth in North Africa and some of the men were at Dieppe. In Sicily they carried ashore units of General Montgomery's British 8th Army that helped mop up that island and then away into Italy. But on their arrival here for their visit home—for many it was the first in two years or more—they were met by a host of welcoming kids when school lets out for the summer.

In command of the flotilla, composed of both Canadian and British sailors, was Lieut. Jack C. Davis of Dunsmuir, B.C. Other officers were Lieut. George Bucknerham, Montreal, George Nuttall, Calgary, Alta., George Allan, Edmonton and Lieut. Walter A. Secrett of Hamilton and Engineering officer.

They trained for weeks in mock operations off the English coast, then got their first chance when the invasion of North Africa began last November. The flotilla, then commanded by another officer, landed about 10 miles from Algiers, while others of the men
