**PEACE IN BALKANS ASSURED FOR THE NEXT FIFTEEN YEARS**

ATHENS, June 29.—Foreign Minister Alessandris of Greece, in a special interview to-day, declared he considers peace the next fifteen years is assured for the next fifteen years.

"Greece, Serbia and Roumania, though they have no formal alliance, have agreed to hold together for the sake of peace," he explained. "Therefore it would be folly on the part of Bulgaria and Albania to plot against peace or attack Greece, Serbia or Roumania."

"Turkey has already signed an agreement with us to respect our frontiers if we respect theirs, as we certainly shall. Besides, we, the three chief Balkan Christian States have agreed to cooperate for the observance of treaties made since the war which affect the Balkans."

"Greece has a formal defensive treaty with Serbia, but Greece does not think to join the Little Entente now, because she is unwilling to enter any political complications."

M. Alessandris does not believe the recent Bulgarian coup d'etat will have any consequences outside that country, "because nobody else wants adventures and Bulgaria is too weak to make trouble alone. Albania is too small and divided to attack her neighbors. Therefore peace is assured in the Balkans."
