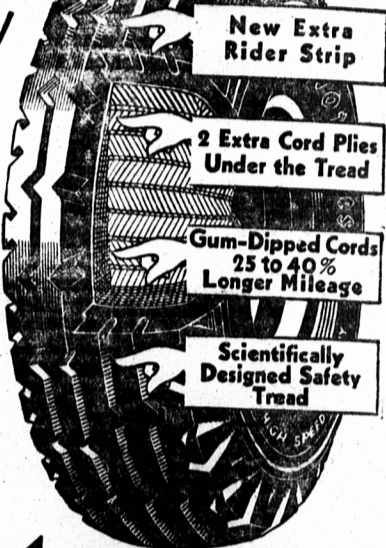

Superior Court Upholds Pandora Patent

MONTREAL, Aug. 17.—On the grounds that the duplication of the wrapping tends to "deceive and mislead" the public, Mr. Justice Duranceau of the Superior Court, sitting in Practice Division here, handed down a judgment which prohibits any competitor of H. Simon and Sons Limited from manufacturing and selling cigars that are enclosed by a shield of cedar wood.

The Superior Court judgment followed the action of H. Simon and Sons Limited in seeking an interlocutory injunction against L. N. Hadd, Montreal, the plaintiff company charging infringement of Canadian Patent No. 256340 which deals with the method of wrapping cigars in cedar.

Upholding the claim of the plaintiff company that they hold the exclusive right to manufacture and wrap cigars in cedar, as indicated by their Pandora product, Mr. Justice Duranceau's judgment also enjoins the restrains any competitor from using the word "Cedar" in connection with the wrapping of cigars and prohibits the similar use of this packaging device by other than H. Simon and Sons, Limited, the plaintiff-petitioners.

British Schools To Be Revised

While we in New Brunswick (says the Telegraph Journal) are discussing educational changes and the larger school unit it is interesting to read what a London correspondent of The Christian Science Monitor observes of the reorganization of British schools. The writer says: "The purpose is to provide advanced and practical instruction for the older children, which is felt to be impossible under the existing conditions of small schools, classes of wide age-range, and non-specialist teachers. The plan entails much rebuilding. There are to be facilities for wood-work, metalwork, cookery, laundry, house-wifery, gardening, bee-keeping, poultry-keeping, in addition

to the ordinary routine lessons of schools. Properly equipped gymnasiums, fully qualified instructors, playing fields and canteens are provided for, in fact, it is as near the ideal as the foresight of the authorities and the pockets of the ratepayers will allow. If it gives all that it promises, it will fulfil one of its objects of which little is said, namely, to arouse on the part of the parents a desire to have the school-leaving age raised to sixteen."

We are further told that "the small schools suffer from an interiority complex. The buildings are small and out of date. There is the feeling that they are but makeshifts until the time comes to go to the proper school."

There, it must be remembered that education and school attendance are compulsory both in law and in practice. Here it is practically in law only.
