A special meeting of the Summerside Town Council took place in the Council Chamber last night. Bills to the amount of \$27.74 were held over till next meeting. A communication from the School Board asking that the Council take some action to complete the large number of children who are of school age to attend school, was referred to the School Board with instructions to the School Board with instructions to inform the trustee officer what they wanted done in the matter. A reply from the Sun Electric Co., to the letter which was passed at the last regular meeting re the light on East Street, was read claiming that the light was ordered by the chairman of the light committee, and that they would look to the town for the cost of placing the same. The Mayor at some length explained his connection with the placing of the light. Councillor Silliphant also explained at some length his conversation with Mr. Grady as to the placing of this light, denying that he gave Mr. Grady instructions where to place it. Mr. Grady who was present was asked to explain and he claimed that the light was ordered by the chairman of the light committee. Mr. Silliphant, Coun. McFarlane thought that the best plan was to set aside the matter as to who was responsible for the placing of it, and decide whether the light was really needed or not. A hot discussion in which the Mayor and all the councillors took part ensued. A motion exonerating the Electric Light Co., and its managers from any blame in placing this light was carried. A letter from the Sun Electric Co. asking for a sidewalk from Spring Street to their power house was handed to the street committee for consideration. A letter from the Bank of Nova Scotia, extending the time of redemption of the water and sewerage bonds to October 1st was read, and a motion presenting a vote of thanks of the Council to the Bank of Nova Scotia was passed unanimously. A letter from T. B. Grady resigning the office of water and sewerage commissioner was read. During the discussion on this matter the Mayor and all the councillors spoke in high terms of Mr. Grady, as to the loss the town would sustain if they accepted Mr. Grady's resignation. Several citizens who were present, spoke by invitation of the Mayor and expressed the hope that Mr. Grady might be induced to withdraw his resignation. Mr. Grady, who was present, was asked to explain the reason of his resigning, which he did at some length and a motion that in view of Mr. Grady's explanation the resignation be not accepted was carried. It was decided that the Mayor and finance committee be a committee to act with the water and sewerage commissioners in any important business which might require the assistance of the Council. Several other matters were attended to.
