ENGLAND TO JOIN RUSSIA?

Startling Combination Rumored in Far East Based on British Change of Front.

WASHINGTON, May 14.—Has England abandoned Japan and formed an alliance with Russia and France? That question, starting in the extreme, is being asked here. Its greatest significance is in the fact that state department officials have propounded it. Their theory is as startling as the basis upon which it rests is plausible.

In the multitude of rumors, the conflict of opinion and the dearth of official information, such is the only construction that can be placed upon England's attitude.

CHANGE OF FRONT.

Her lukewarmness to Japan in the Newchwang incident, following so closely upon her violent outbursts over the Manchurian squabble, raised a suspicion of a change of front that was not entertained by the higher officials.

When it became known to-day, however, that it had been officially announced in the English parliament that the British consul at Newchwang denied that the Russians had reoccupied Newchwang, the suspicion of England became general. Officials here are certain that the Russians did re-occupy Newchwang. The press despatches from Consul Miller and Minister Conger both confirmed the news.

Only upon the theory of a new alliance, and a thorough understanding as to the partitioning of China can these facts be harmonized or understood.

Despite repeated denials, Russia's designs on Manchuria are well understood. It is suspected that when the proper time comes Russia will assert her sovereignty over Manchuria, with perhaps more of the northern part of China.

England will take the Yangtze valley, which is now in her sphere of influence, and the adjoining territory. France may extend the border of French Indo-China so far east and north as she pleases.

Such an understanding, if it exists, would upset the balance of power in Europe. It would mean a change in the map of the world.

A BOODLING SENATOR.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., May 18.—Unable to bear the strain of mental torture, which, he says, he has suffered since the grand jury investigation into legislative boodling was instituted, former state Senator Fred. L. Busche went before Circuit Attorney Folk this afternoon and made a complete and far reaching confession of his connection with corrupt deals extending over a period of eight years.

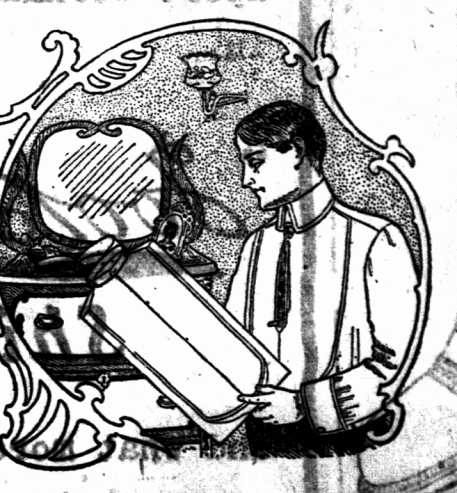
