BANK MERGER RATIFIED.
OTTAWA, August, 25—The government has approved the purchase of the stock, assets, etc. of the Traders Bank by the Royal Bank. Consideration of the subject has been delayed by the absence from town of the minister of finance. On his return to Ottawa on Friday he called a meeting of the treasury board at which the matter was discussed and the application sanctioned. A subsequent meeting of council ratified the motion of the treasury board. What is sometimes called the amalgamation, in reality it is an absolute purchase of one bank by the other, thus is completed.
The Bank act, as revised in 1901 expressly recognizes the policy of permitting one bank to sell its assets and business to another. Its specifically sets out the procedure which must be taken before the sale becomes valid and operative. After the agreement of sale and purchase has been accepted by the board of directors of the respective banks, meetings of the shareholders are called after ample notice for ratification. If the shareholders approve, application is made to the treasury board for its approval and the consent of

A WISE MOTHER.
'I have taught my children,' said a mother, 'to come to me immediately for even a pin scratch. I do not mean to exaggerate little pains, but my father, who was a physician, taught me how easy was precaution besides cure. I always keep on hand two good antiseptics, Isterine and boracic in solution. Every fresh wound or scratch is bathed cleanly and wrapped in sterilized cheese-cloth, before a particle of dirt can enter it. One often finds children with stub-

born sores on their hands and feet, which takes forever to heal. The ugliest wound if cared for immediately, will heal immediately.
In nearly every city during the winter a course is given on nursing and simple surgical work, which a mother may find both interesting and profitable. If this is not available, I would advise every mother to go to her physician and pay him a fee, if necessary for a lesson on cleaning a wound and bandaging it, as well as what to do for the bruises and contusions which are of daily occurrence in a growing family.
The governor-general-in-council. The tenor of the act is to the effect that this consent will not be given unless there are substantial reasons against it. In this particular case the shareholders of the two institutions at their respective meetings unanimously approved of the agreement negotiated by the directors. No objection has been filed against the transaction by any shareholder.
The branches of the Traders Bank are confined for the most part to Ontario and the middle west, while the Royal Bank is strongly represented in the maritime provinces and on the Pacific coast. The union of the two thus will form an institution with branches widely distributed throughout the Dominion. The Traders Bank had eleven branches in all in Canada and the Royal has 200 branches, which are duplicated, at 15 points only and many of these are large centers well equipped with branch banks. Seven of these duplicating points are in Ontario, two in Alberta, two in Saskatchewan and one each in Manitoba, British Columbia and Quebec.

MILLIONAIRES FOUGHT FIAMES.
CHICAGO, Aug. 25—Millionaires, judges, bankers and noted athletes formed a volunteer bucket brigade and made an ineffectual attempt today to save from fire the club house of the Chicago Golf Club, which is to be the scene of the national tournament next month. Only one wing of the structure escaped the flames. The loss is estimated at \$75,000. No one was injured. The cause is unknown. It was announced that the fire would not interfere with the national amateur championship play which begins on September 2. More than \$25,000 was raised before sunset toward building a new club house. Temporary quarters will be arranged at once to care for the players who will take part in the national tournament.

BURGLARS ESCAPED.
TORONTO, Aug. 25—Two shop-breakers late tonight, by fine nerve got clear away from sixteen police constables and a detective, who surrounded them in a lane. A watchman saw the thieves prying the bar of Scheuer's jewellery store and telephoned the police. The police officers got to the scene of the robbery by two lanes, and when the thieves found themselves surrounded, they fired their revolvers at the rear of Bingham's drug store. In the excitement the men disappeared as if the earth had opened and swallowed them.

**ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The homesteader must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry forms may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 40 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts an homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the home land or pre-emption six months in each half year from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties.—Must reside on the land in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres 20 or at a house worth \$2000.
