### World Construction

Pastor C. Roberts, of Toronto, one of the International Bible Students' evangelists stated in Montreal last week that between the present date and the year 1925, the greatest time of trouble that the earth has ever seen will be experienced, and as he referred to the present industrial crisis in Great Britain, the massing up of the French armies for enforcing demands upon Germany, the friction between the United States and Japan, he seemed to be satisfied that all these clouds were clear indication of the beginning of his predictions, or perhaps continuation since he dated the great upheaval from 1914, when according to his chronology, a new era was ushered in.

The theme of the address was "God's Reconstruction of the World, and How it Will be Accomplished." Pastor Roberts spoke of the fact that the desire for reform had seized the world all round, that there had been an awakening, which would fulfill the scriptural promise of a great shaking. The prophet's reference to the shaking of the heavens the earth, the sea, and the dry land, he interpreted by making the dry land represent the aristocracy and privileged classes, the earth the powers of political control, the sea the laboring classes, the heavens spiritual control. Jerusalem will be the capital of the new order of things, declared Pastor Roberts, and by the year 1925 the new kingdom will be erected in that land.

### PREMIER MEIGHEN TALKS TO CUBA

OTTAWA, April 16.—The first long-distance telephone conversation between Canada and Cuba took place this afternoon at 4.30 when Right Hon. Arthur Meighen, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, Hon. W. S. Fielding, and Hon. Rudolphe Lemieux spoke in turn from the Parliament Buildings to President Mario G. Menocal, who had called up from the Presidential Palace at Havana, Cuba, to extend the greetings of the Republic of Cuba to the Dominion of Canada.

The conversation from the other end of the line could be heard as plainly as though the person telephoning had been in the next room, according to the Prime Minister, and the other gentlemen who spoke to President Menocal. Part of the line was under water some seventy miles, from

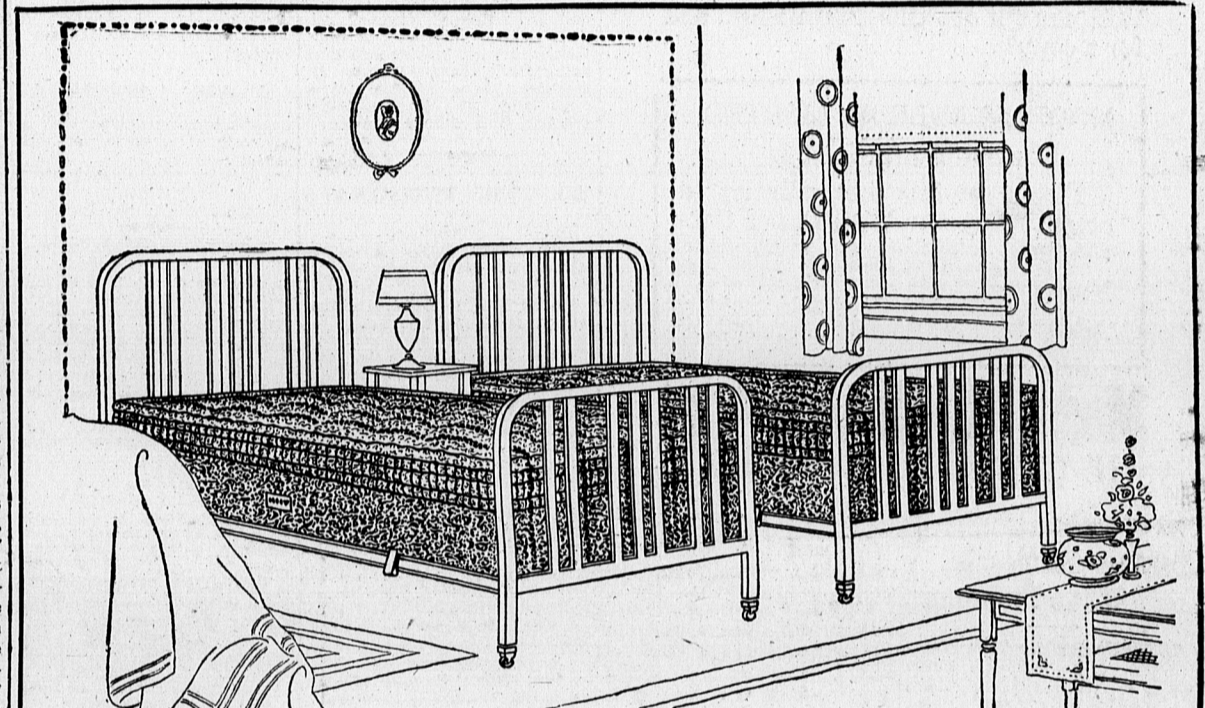
