**British Protest Invitation To Arturo Toscanini**

LONDON, Oct. 18 — (Reuters) — London's invitation to 82-year-old Arturo Toscanini to conduct at the opening of a new Festival-of-Britain concert hall in 1951 has struck a discord among some Britons which still is vibrating through the newspapers.

Why, they protest, was not a British conductor chosen?

The announcement that the conductor of the NBC orchestra had been asked to conduct was made last week by the chairman of the London County Council, J. W. Bowen, when Prime Minister Clement Attlee laid the foundation stone of the hall.

The hall will in its first year serve as a concert auditorium for the 1951 exhibition, and a part of the Festival of Britain.

Critics of the choice do not attempt to question Toscanini's eminence among conductors, but maintain the new London concert hall should have an entirely British opening.

"Scandalous is the mildest suggestion that a stranger — no matter how eminent — should be invited," one letter to the London Daily Telegraph said. The writer suggested it was a "deliberate insult" to Sir Thomas Beecham, leading British conductor who has strongly attacked the plan for a 1951 exhibition.

The Festival of Britain organizing authorities disclaim any part in the choice and the London Council is standing by its invitation to Toscanini.



LONDON, Oct. 17 — (AP) — Britain produced 33,322 automobiles during August and allocated 20,105 of them for export, the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders announced. During the month 2,881 were sent to Canada.
