NEW YORK, Aug. 15—Cincinnati crowded six runs into the seventh and ninth innings today to come from behind and humble Pittsburgh's National League leaders 6-2.

He added that while Hartnett would not be able to catch for that period, he might be able to work in as a pinch hitter "within 10 days or so."
