**Stock Markets at A Glance**

**TORONTO, Nov. 28 — (CP) —**  
 Stocks fell into a downward drift  
 today on the Toronto Exchange  
 and all index figures were down  
 at the close. The gold issues led  
 the retreat, a drop of 45, trailed  
 by the western oils showing a loss  
 of 26. Base metal stocks posted  
 a minor index loss.

**MONTREAL, Nov. 28 — (CP) —**  
 All groups were forced down in  
 the indices in transactions today  
 on the stock exchange and curb  
 market, though here and there  
 were individual spots of strength.

**WINNIPEG, Nov. 28 — (CP) —**  
 Flour buying from the United  
 Kingdom was active today on the  
 Winnipeg grain exchange with  
 business placed at 2,500,000 equiv-  
 alent bushels of wheat.

**CHICAGO, Nov. 28 — (AP) —**  
 Interest in rye futures was active  
 in today's trading. Deferred con-  
 tracts were strong. December was  
 sold against purchases of the May  
 contract by Longs as well as lo-  
 cal traders, but closed strong.

**NEW YORK, Nov. 28 — (AP) —**  
 Selective advances of fractions to  
 around a point were well distrib-  
 uted in today's stock market al-  
 though exceptions were numerous.  
 The Associated Press 60-stock  
 average was unchanged at 55.2.  
 Transfers totalled 867,860, largest  
 in about two weeks, compared  
 with 737,534 Monday.

**Another Canadian Wins Victoria Cross**

A peacetime automobile mechanic and welder, Maj. Currie displayed the heroism that won him the Empire's highest award for valor in an action which started in the village of St. Lambert Sur Dives Aug. 20 and continued for three days and three nights.

The citation said that all the officers under his command were either killed or wounded and "when his force was finally relieved, and he was satisfied that the turnover was complete, he fell asleep on his feet and collapsed."

Maj. Currie first attacked and seized the village which was a key point of the Chambois-Trun escape route for the remnants of two German armies cut off in the Falaise Pocket. He held it through three days and nights of continuous fighting, hurling back repeated enemy attempts to force a breakthrough. His strategy was successful in blocking the German escape route.

Defence Minister McNaughton has sent a message to Mrs. Currie who lives with her eight-year-old son — David Foster — at Owen Sound, Ont., in which he said that "I am sure that the story of your husband's bravery will ever remain a source of inspiration not only to the present generation but also to posterity."

Says the citation: "Throughout the operations the casualties to Maj. Currie's force were heavy. However, he never considered the possibility of failure or allowed it to enter the minds of his men. In the words of one of his non-commissioned officers, 'we know at
