THE FIREMEN.

Early in the history of every town and city some organized body to protect life and property against destruction by fire is formed. Such a body usually grows with the growth of the town, and its equipment keeps pace with the advancing improvements of the age. Compare a well-equipped fire department today with one of thirty or forty years ago and this progress will be apparent. Ottawa, the Dominion capital, thirty-five years ago was served by a few hand engines, which in turn were dependant upon water hauled in casks up the steep river banks.

Fire is proverbially a good servant, but the hardest of hard masters. And the danger is ever near at hand. Every one must have fire in the home, in the place of business, the store, the office, the factory; for warmth, for cooking, for the creation of steam. And every one must have the means of fighting fire readily, the friction match, in the store, the pocket, in every room in the house. We hedge in these numerous fires with walls of iron, brick and stone, but in ten thousand cases there is but an inch or two between the flame and the most inflammable material.

After all, considering the multitude of fires kept for use, the many agencies for producing fire, and the too prevalent carelessness, the wonder is not that destructive fires are so frequent, but that they so seldom make headway. When this does occur the results are appalling—a home and the savings of a lifetime gone up in smoke in an hour; a city laid in ashes in a night. Fire is indeed a hard master, relentless, cruel, satisfied with nothing less than the total destruction of all property and life within its reach, and like death itself it has all seasons for its own, the summers heat, the winter's cold, at noon, or midnight, in storm or calm.

Between the city and this destructive and cruel enemy stands the fire brigade. This army must never be disbanded. Wars between nations are terminated by treaties of peace. No truce nor treaty can bind this treacherous servant, fire. In any unexpected moment it becomes an enemy and a fiend, and we in our helplessness summon the fire fighters. And with what alacrity they respond! At any hour of the day or the night, in storm or calm, always ready, alert, efficient, they are on the spot, battling bravely, taking great risks of limb or life, putting forth every effort, regardless of hunger, cold or weariness, till the enemy is subdued and life and property are again safe. Theirs is strenuous, difficult, toilsome work.

It is noble, self-sacrificing work, to this work of the firemen. Often have they saved to a citizen his home and his

treasures; sometimes a block and sometimes the city itself owes its existence to their efforts. We owe them much—how much we do not often pause to consider. Their pecuniary rewards are too trivial for account; their one great reward is the sense of duty done and the appreciation of their fellow citizens. We rely upon them by day and night, with a trust that has never been betrayed. All honor to the Firemen!

Today we have with us visiting firemen from the maritime cities and towns, who have done the same good work for the communities in which they live that our own Brigade has done and is doing here. They meet in friendly competition, the object of which is to test and to increase their efficiency in every department and exercise of their noble calling. Let every citizen give these sports his patronage. Our visitors and our own men are worthy of it. The Tournament itself will afford a series of engaging events all based on utility, and worth a hundred of the cheap pastimes which serve only to smudge the minds of volatile persons.

Some increase of drunkenness on the streets is noted of late and calls for special care and vigilance on the part of the prosecutor and the police, especially during the time of the Firemen's Tournament. Our good city has now a reputation to sustain.

Among the incidents of life in the Northwest are hailstorms such as that reported in yesterday's Guardian, which totally destroyed eight thousand acres of standing wheat. The loss, reckoned at 25 bushels per acre, would be 200,000 bushels, a very serious loss indeed even if it be but a small fraction of the total crop. Probably not all the losses from hail in a hundred years in Prince Edward Island would amount to a tenth part of the loss from this one storm in Saskatchewan. We are told that but few of the Saskatchewan farmers were insured, which goes to show that hail storms are there so frequent as to become a regularly insurable risk, as fire is in other countries and here. This is a matter worth considering by any one who thinks of giving up a good home here and migrating to the west.
