## THE FISHERMEN OF CAPE BRETON MEET WITH HEAVY LOSSES

### Hundreds of Nets, Moorings, and Lobster Traps Swept Away by Ice, and the Loss is Estimated at Fifteen Thousand Dollars

St. Peter's, N. S., May 30.—The drift ice which for several weeks hovered about the east coast of Cape Breton made its appearance at Point Misheau on Sunday last, and since then has swept the coast westerly by L'Ardoise, Roekdale, and St. Peter's, and has extended far up Lennox Passages.

On Monday the wind set in from the north and this encouraged the fishermen along the coast to believe that the ice would be driven out to sea. That afternoon hundreds of nets were set out in anticipation of the appearance of mack rail, which were hourly expected. On Monday night the ice swept ashore and carried away everything before it in the shape of nets, moorings and lobster traps of which there were thousands set.

The loss to the fishermen of L'Ardoise, Roekdale, and Grand Cove can be estimated at fifteen thousand dollars in gear carried away and destroyed. This on the

## Old Bible Books to be Inserted

ITHACA, N. Y., May 31.—The Bible of the future will again contain all of the sacred books that have been eliminated from it by a critical process in the ancient synagogues and the early Christian Church," said Prof. Nathaniel Schmidt, of the department of Semitic languages and Oriental history of Cornell University, in an interview. Prof. Schmidt was formerly a clergyman, but for many years has been at the head of the department he now presides over at Cornell, and is regarded as one of the most profound scholars and thinkers in Ithaca. He has made long and searching studies of the scriptures, has traveled for years in Palestine and Asia Minor, and has a reputation for his knowledge of Hebrew and biblical as well as the literature of the world.

"These books," declared Prof. Schmidt, "were at one time in the Bible. Some of them are now in the Catholic Bible, but they have been removed from the latter-day Protestant Bible. They are mostly inaccessible to the general public, but were widely read by the synagogues and the early church. I mean for example such books as the Book of Wisdom of Jesus the Son of Sarah, the Wisdom of Solomon, Judith, Tobit, the Books of the Maccabees, as well as the Psalter of Solomon, the Apocalypses of Enoch, Baruch and Ezra. These books will be restored to their place in the canonical scriptures."

GIVES HIS REASONS.

Prof. Schmidt then gave his reasons for this view. "The reasons that led to their rejection," declared Prof. Schmidt, "do not exist today. In the early days whatever was objectionable to the doctrines of one church was discarded by it and thrown aside." He pointed out that the Protestant Church discarded the Apocalypses because it objected to some of the doctrines they taught, for instance, salvation through good

## ARREARS OF TAXES

### NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

Notice is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1907, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of Arrears of Taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of Arrears of 1906 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same, nor the mailing of Final Notices to Defaulters; and it gives the Government the additional power, after the Tax is one month over due, of suing in a Court, and of levying on all goods and chattels found on the premises or in possession of the party sued. Where there are no goods and chattels, or not sufficient to levy on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

The new Act, as well as the old, declares all taxes to be "Crown debts," having priority over all other Claims, Judgments, Mortgages, Bills of Sale etc. All Taxes will be sued for in the name of the King.

Persons in Arrears for Land, Road or Income Tax are requested to make immediate payment to save expenses.

## ARMY BALLOON BLOWN AWAY

LONDON, May 31.—A military balloon with six men in the car, which was sent up from Aldershot Camp, May 28, during the review in honor of the Prince of Japan, is missing and it is feared that it has been blown out to sea. King Edward and Prince Fushimi witnessed the ascension. A strong wind was blowing at the time and the balloon was soon carried out of sight. Since then no tidings of the aeronauts have been received.

A military balloon piloted by Lieutenants Gaulthier and Leak, of the Royal Engineers, which was sent up from Aldershot Camp, May 28, was picked up at sea by a fishing smack this morning, some distance from Exmouth, County of Devon, at the mouth of the Exmouth in the English Channel. The fate of the officers is a mystery but it is hoped that they may have been picked up by a passing vessel.

## HE TORE DOWN BRITISH FLAG

PUEBLO CORTES, Honduras, May 31.—A letter has been received by Commander Fullam, of the United States Gunboat Marieta from E. C. Fiallo, Minister of Foreign Relations of the Provisional Government, regarding the tearing down of the British flag by Isaula, a municipal officer of Honduras, but Commander Fullam having mailed it to the State Department in Washington, declined to give a copy for publication or a copy of his report to Fiallo. The reply of Commander Fullam is said to have called attention to the failure of the Government to comply with the demands that Isaula should not again be appointed to office and caustically comments on the fact that such offences as Isaula committed are relegated to Nicaraguan courts to punish. It now appears that the captain of the British Man-O-War Indefatigable intended to require Isaula to return to El Tovar and hoist the British flag he had torn down, but the ship was called to Santa Lucia on report of a riot there. Great Britain may not accept Fiallo's denial of Honduran responsibility, hence the Isaula incident remains open.
