—NOW SAFE IN FRANCE.—Mr. J. Sullivan of Summerside who recently received word that his son, who has been in France for the past few years has been missing and now I think in action has now received the good news that he is safe with his unit in France. Private Sullivan enlisted in June 1915 with the 55th Batt. was transferred to the 26th in France and while serving the 5th Bat. was wounded in July 1916. He was sent to England for treatment and returned to France as stretcher bearer with the 14th. From this battalion he was transferred to the machine gun squadron and has taken part in much heavy fighting. His friends are glad to hear he is safe.—L.

—MR. FRED TANTON DEAD.—The flag on the Masonic Lodge Building, Summerside was at half staff on Tuesday on account of the death of one of their members Mr. Fred G. Tanton which occurred at the home of his parents Mr. and Mrs. Benj. Tanton of St. Eleanor's late Monday night from influenza and pneumonia. Deceased was 31 years of age. He graduated from P. W. C. about ten years ago and for a number of years studied law in the office of Messrs Bell and Tanton Summerside. Later he went west on account of ill health and returned home about three years ago. For the past few months he had been employed as manager of the automobile department for Messrs R. P. Holman Ltd. He was one of Summerside's most popular young men and will be greatly missed by a large circle of friends. Besides his parents there are left to mourn two brothers Messrs B. W. Tanton of Bell & Tanton, law office and Stanley at home, also two sisters Mrs. George Andrew of St. Eleanor's and Miss Madeline Tanton, General Superintendent nurse of the military hospital of British Columbia. The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon.—L.

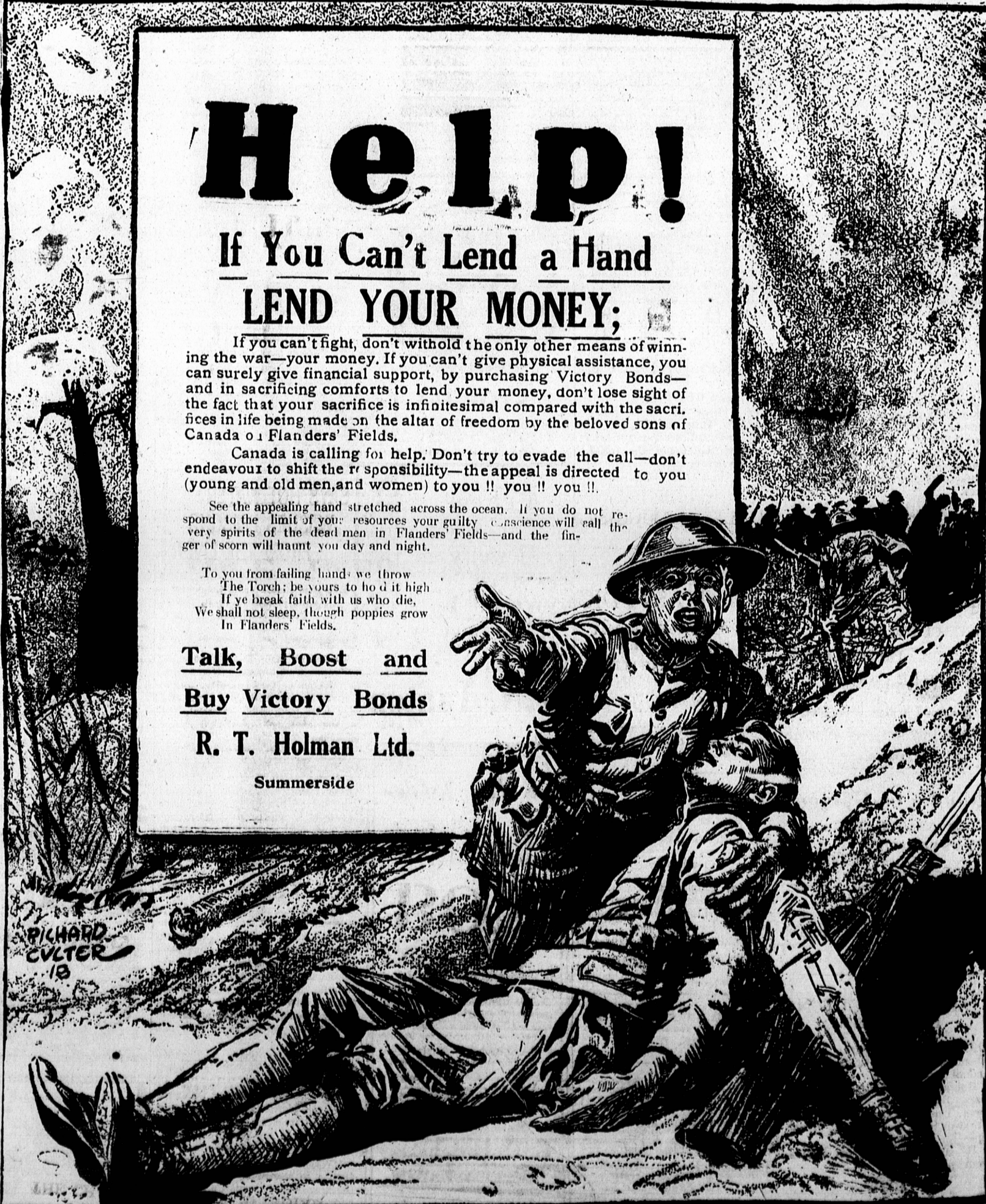
