The Fashionable New Jewelry



One really must see the new jewelry to understand how beautiful and artistic are the designs and colorings. Oddity, originality and beauty of workmanship, rather than intrinsic value are the things sought for in the so-called 'art nouveau' jewelry.

The dattened and twisted dull silver and gold bands of the settings hold cabochon stones, dull pink or green tourmaline, opal matrix, beryls, amethyst, chryso-prase, jade, malachite, Hapias, necklets, pendants, brooches, buckles, etc.

Some very odd and attractive rings are also to be had in this jewelry, and if one desires, uncut stones can be bought and set to order for finger rings.

A Pretty and Attractive Nursery.

There are always mothers who, like love, can "find the way" to do what ought to be done. And this is a way that on a mother found to furnish a nursery prettily and without a large outlay, but with a lot of stuff in it that could not go to the laundry as often as necessary.

The first attention was given to the walls. It was imagined that when picture papers were produced, the question of nursery walls was answered. This mullin makes perhaps the cheapest covering of any, but there are a great number of washable cotton stuffs that make excellent wall coverings, all to be had for a few cents a yard.

No matter what material was used for the main part of the wall, the unbleached muslin is the best for the border. Lay the stencil in the strip, pinning it to keep in place while you work, and trace with black paint the outline out in the stencil.

Once the black outlines are on, the rest is a child's work. Just fill in all the spaces with flat color, now pink or blue for a child's frock, brown or black for a boy's trousers.

Soft, dull green is the best for the background, washed in with long, sidewise strokes of the brush. The duller greens, with a bit of brown or yellowish green for relief, are better than the natural grass green, which is too glaring here.

The floor is of next importance after the walls. Carpets soil so readily with children playing on them, so do away entirely with them. Have a rug instead, one that can go in the tub as often as needed, and be none the worse for it.

Any upholstered furniture should be covered at once with some washable material. If the nursery is a bedroom as well, there are the bedroom things to think of. The window curtains should be kept as simple as possible.

lap; any of these makes a good floor covering. Sew the stripes together to form a square of the desired size for a large rug. Stencil a border and leave the centre plain. Paint in letter than crayon for these heavy materials.

The window curtains should be kept as simple as possible. Scrim and batiste are the most practical, considering expense and wearing qualities; lawn or batiste will make very good covers for bureau, bed and chiffonier.
