Are the faithful old can-openers to be turned out to pasture? Future homemakers may not even know how to wind one for three types of new cans are being groomed for their debut. For a room that does not get much sunlight, sheer light draperies are important for the windows. Suggested for such a room are white net glass curtains and sheer paneled draperies of a soft green and pale yellow. These colors would blend nicely in a room in which green, rust, brown and beige are also used.

Keep brown sugar in a receptacle without a lid; closed up it gets lumpy and sticky. A lump of sugar in the corner of a tin will cause rime for ages. If you have to keep dinner warm, put it on the upper shelf of the oven with the gas turned very low and place a shallow bowl of water on the shelf below; this prevents any drying up of dinner!

The killing of rats is not a hereditary instinct in cats. Experiments prove it to be an acquired characteristic. Tests have shown that it is just as natural for a cat to live in harmony with rats as it is to kill them. Cats are taught to kill rats either by their own kind or by human beings. Of twenty cats bred in isolation and entirely uninduced, nine that is 45 per cent, were rat killers. Of twenty-one kittens reared together with rat-killing parents, eighteen or more than 85 per cent, were rat killers. Cats which only four months old were brought up together with rats never attacked the latter, but sometimes killed rats of other breeds. Of eleven cats brought up together with rats, nine became hunters after watching other cats. Vegetable diet or hunger had no influence on the tendency to kill rats.

## THE COOK'S CORNER

### GINGER PEAR CONSERVE

- 6 cups dried pears
  - 1 cup crushed pineapple
  - 1 lemon
  - 1 orange
  - 5 cups sugar
  - 3 tablespoons chopped preserved ginger
- Method: Peel and core the pears and crush them finely. Drain the crushed pears thoroughly. Grate the rind from the orange and lemon and then squeeze out the juice of each. Combine the prepared pears, pineapple, grated rind and juice of the lemon and orange, and the sugar. Heat gently to the simmering point, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Then cook gently until the mixture has thickened, about 40 minutes. Add the preserved ginger and continue cooking a few minutes longer. Pour into hot, sterilized jars seal with melted paraffin.

### MILADY'S CONSERVE

- 1 pound peaches
  - 1 pound pear
  - 2 pounds apples
  - 2 lemons
  - 3 pounds sugar
  - 1 small bottle marshchino cherries
- Method: Dip the peaches in boiling water and then in cold water. Peel them, cut in halves, remove the stones and slice. Peel, core and slice the pears and apples. Cook the apples slowly until tender, then add the sliced peaches and pears, the grated rind and juice from the lemons and the sugar. Heat slowly to the simmering point, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Then cook gently, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking until the mixture thickens. Drain the cherries thoroughly and chop them into small pieces. Add to the conserve, mixing well. Cook a few minutes longer. Pour into hot, sterilized jars and seal at once.
