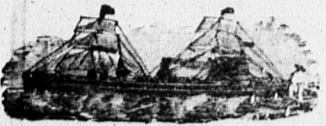

### REOPENING OF POWNAL CHURCH.

After a thorough cleaning, walls painted, ceiling tinted, woodwork varnished, choir stand nicely re-carpeted, and two beautiful and up-to-date chairs replacing the old but comfortable sofa, for the use of the minister, the church at Pownal was re-opened on Sunday, the 17th inst. The Rev. Mr. Harrison preached in the morning to a very good congregation from Acts 3:7. The subject was the gospel of the helping hand, as displayed in the healing of the lame man at the beautiful gate of the Temple. Some of the points in the discourse, 1st. The awful helplessness of the cripple. 2nd. The gate of the sanctuary, the place of sympathy and amelioration for human needs in the days of old and at the present time. 3rd. The disciples of Jesus did not pass him by on the threshold of the temple. They paused and took in the distressing situation of the afflicted man. Their past thrilling experiences as witnesses of their Master's death, resurrection, the uplifting power of the transcendent transactions of the upper room, where the Christian Church was born, and of His triumphant ascension to Heaven did not lessen their sympathy and consideration for the helpless cripple, but augmented it and intensified it. The most heavenly-minded have been the kindest and most practical helpers of their fellow-men. 4th. The fixed look of Peter and John, and the intense gaze of the Church of today upon the whole scene of human need born of deep conviction and of a lofty faith. 5th. The transforming power of the helping hand. We must come into close touch with those we faint would help. 6th. The joy of the healed cripple. He stands, walks, leaps, in his new-found freedom. The call today the world over, is for the strong, sympathetic willing right hand touch. The hand inspired, moved and sustained by a living uplifting and sublime faith, Christianity's highest and most convincing credential is found in the practical application of this principle, and the healed man filing the Christian temple with the story of the gospel that helped and saved

them.

In the afternoon the Rev. Mr. Erb occupied the pulpit. The Rev. Gentleman preached an able soul-comforting, inspiring sermon, from Psalm 147:11 "The Lord taketh pleasure in them that fear him." The following is a very short synopsis of this excellent discourse. The text gives us two characteristics of the true worshipper. He fears God, not the fear of a guilty conscience but a commingling of several of the deepest emotions of the Soul. He hopes in the mercy of God, as manifested in the sacrifice of Christ. A hope like this is well founded. God takes pleasure in this class, not in their failings. These grieve him, but in their return to him when they have wandered away. It gives God infinite pleasure to see a prodigal come home. He takes pleasure in those feelings of insufficiency that we sometimes feel, because it is only that sense of a heart that will let God fill it with power. Paul said when I am weak then am I strong. He takes pleasure in the service that proceeds from pure motives. No odds how imperfect that service is, if it is the best we can render in his name it is accepted.

There is a two fold reason why God takes pleasure in us. The first is because we belong to Christ and He takes pleasure in him and who are his. The human soul has great unfolding possibilities, and as God thinks of what we shall become in the great unending future, His holy nature is thrilled with the most entrancing pleasure.

It is certainly a blessed thing to belong to Christ. He alone can help us to develop our possibilities, and we should seek to live so that He can take pleasure in our every word, thought and act.

In the evening the Rev. Dr. Herzog preached an excellent sermon, from the latter part of the 9th v. of the 2nd Chapter of Philippians. "The name which is above every name." He said in opening, a name is very significant, it enables us to distinguish between things as Horse, Cow, etc., names of men and women, different objects etc. But this is a God given name. "God highly exalted him and gave unto him the name, which is above every name." "Jesus the name high over all." "Angels and men before it fall and devils fear and fly." There is no other name given under heaven by which we can be saved. There is a power in "the" name, it mutes the cripple at the beautiful gate of the temple and walk. It is the name to sinners dear. It is a wonderful name. His name shall be called "Wonderful Councilor, the Mighty God, the Prince of Peace." And the Father repeatedly said this is My beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. He finished the work I gave him to do, His name shall be called Jesus, for he shall save His people from their sins. This epitome gives a very poor conception of the interesting and scholarly discourse.

The Choir on each occasion rendered suitable selections and were highly complimented by each of the Rev. Gentlemen, on the excellence of the music, the appropriate selection and the heartiness of the singing. We have not learned what the offering amounted to but believe the people gave liberally.

### SUSPECT UNDER ARREST IN CHICAGO.

CHICAGO, July 22.—A man answering the description of Dr. Crippen, who is wanted for the murder of his wife in London, was arrested here today.

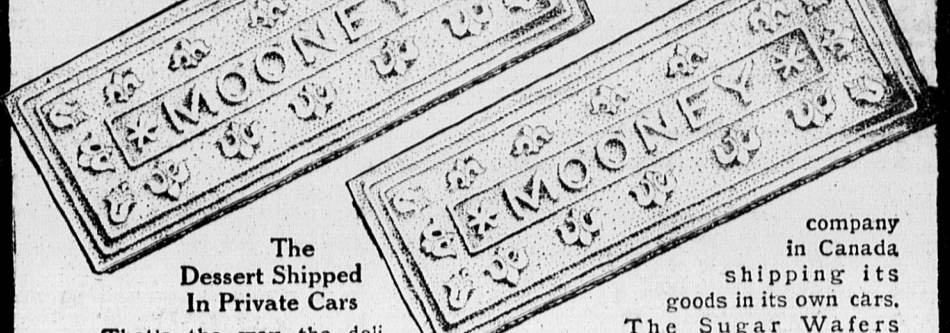
