Residents of Ontario continue to savor their third severe heat wave of the summer, but elsewhere in Canada the temperature is returning to the summer normal. A 99-degree peak in Toronto yesterday was an all-time high for Aug. 9 in that city and gave Toronto its hottest day so far this year. Continued heat is forecast for today in the Ontario Capital.

Ontario recorded 97 degrees, the same as on Monday, the hottest Aug. 8-9 since weather records were started there in 1890. The previous high for Aug. 9 was 92, reached in 1893 and 1924.
