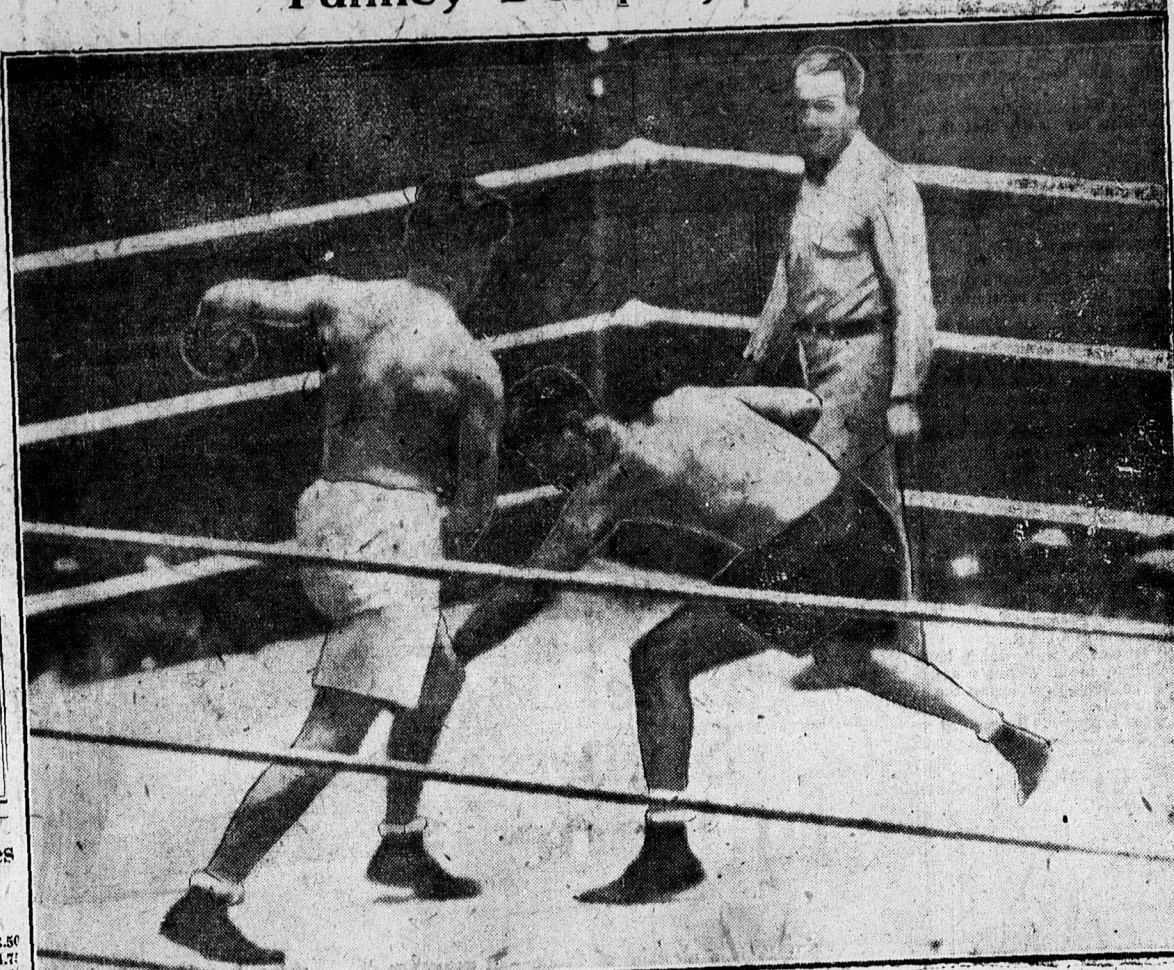

### 150 Bards Meet In Brittany

(British United Press.) PARIS, Sept. 27.—At a Celtic revival held at Quimper, not only Breton bards but delegations from Wales, Scotland and Ireland took part in the celebrations, which were organized by M. de Salsg, an important Breton manufacturer, who believes in the keeping up of old customs. A huge camp, where 2,500 persons could live comfortably, was installed around a hilllock.

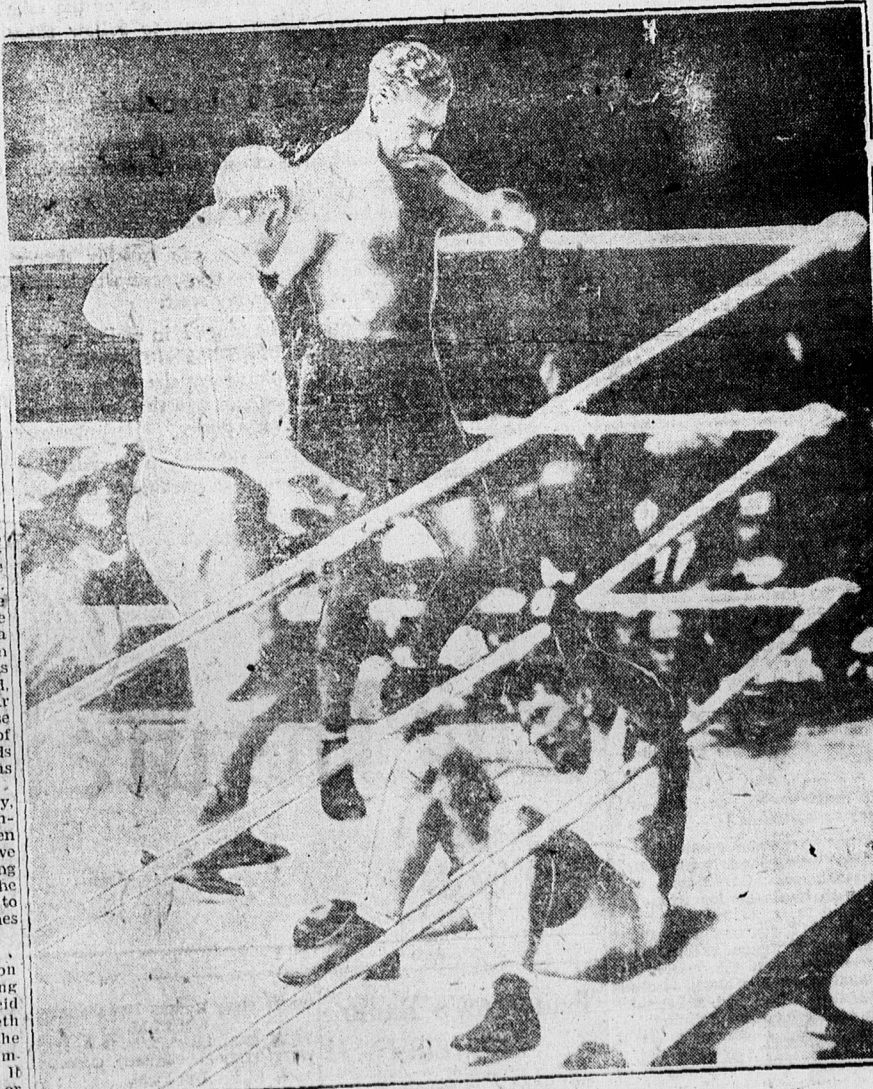
The ceremony began with a procession of 150 bards from Brittany and Great Britain headed by 12 Scottish pipers, the Golden Gorse, and a group of the prettiest girls from Pont Aven.

Then the bards and Druids arrived on the field for the Drseed, or Celtic congress. They surrounded a large dolmen (cromlech), where stood the Gaelic Arch-Druid Cian, in robes embroidered with oak leaves; the Breton Druid, Taldir, two Gaelic and Breton sword-bearers, and the bard Ablor, in a blue gown, with a horn slung at his side.

An interesting incident was the taking of the oath of fidelity to the Celtic spirit. The Vicomte de la Guahardiere, a noble figure with flowing white beard, held in his hands King Arthur's great sword, six feet long, and all those near enough touched the shoulders of those who had placed their hands on the steel, and so the oath was taken.

After this impressive ceremony, the Druid Taldir consecrated a number of the bards; everyone then mounted the hilllock with its five memorial columns, commemorating five famous Bretons, including the bard hotel, who sang his song to homesick Bretons in the trenches during the war.

### National Hockey League Change Rules Of Playing

CHICAGO, Sept. 27.—At a meeting of officials of the National Hockey League here yesterday, President Frank Calder was authorized to sign an agreement affiliating the Central Hockey Association with the National League.

The officials of the National League made several changes, for the most part in playing rules. J. Cooper Smeaton, of Montreal, was appointed referee-in-chief in gaining uniform interpretation of the rules.

Significant changes were: The wage price for transfer of players was raised from \$2,500 to \$5,000.

The period of overtime play was reduced from 20 to 10 minutes. The length of hockey sticks was restricted to 53 inches.

(There had been no limit formerly.)

The blade of goal-keepers' sticks was limited in length to 14 inches. The size of goal-keepers' leg pads was reduced from 12 to 10 inches in width.

A new clause was written regarding the question of interference, to the effect that any players not in possession of the puck shall not interfere with any other play-

er of the opposing side not actually playing the puck, by cross checking or holding. A player shall not be considered in possession of the puck until it has been touched by another.

The rule regarding offside play was strengthened to the effect that a defending player shall not be considered offside in his area if he receives the puck in that area.

A provision was made in regard to goal scoring. "The goal shall not be scored if the puck is put into the goal by any part of an attacking player or his skates."

A rule was made prohibiting a goal-keeper from holding the puck longer than three seconds or traveling more than four feet out with it.

The anti-defence rule was strengthened by providing a minor penalty for three men being behind the blue line.

Deliberately picking up the puck by any player except the goal-keeper was made a minor penalty.

The officials voted to set the new Ross net-in games this year. The date of the annual meeting was changed from the last Saturday in September to the second Saturday in May.

Governors of all hockey clubs in the league were re-elected with the exception of the Boston and Toronto clubs. C. F. Adams was elected to succeed Art Ross, of the Boston club. On the Toronto club, Charles Querle was replaced by J. C. Smythe.

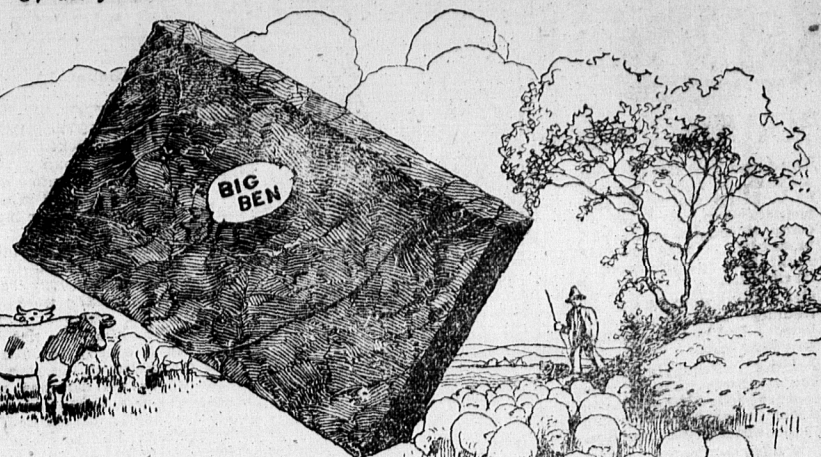
### DIAGNOSING PLUG TROUBLE

To initiate, the character of the deposit on the porcelain packet of the spark plug denotes the cause of plug trouble, and is a clue to an engine condition that may call urgently for a remedy. If the deposit is a dry, powdery substance, the chances are that it is caused by running on too rich a carburetor mixture. If, on the other hand, it is a crusty, oily mass, the indications point to oil leaking past the piston rings in excessive quantity. The difference in the character of the deposit is easily discernable.

### REMOVE VENT CAPS FIRST

Battery experts point out that one of the most common failings of the motorist who charges his battery at home on the transformer used on the radio set, in his failure to remove the vent caps from the cells before turning on the current. While no immediate harm is apparent from this practice, removal of the caps permits the ready escape of gases generated

### PRECAUTION IS NECESSARY

There is one point the home repairer should remember regarding adjustments of the differential gears and that is that the work calls for the utmost precision. Incorrect adjustment will result in rapid wear and unless one is absolutely certain of one's ability, the job should be left to the expert mechanic. Properly lubricated, differential gears will wear the life of the car but in case of trouble from any cause, it is wise to remember that the remedy is a delicate one.

### WHERE BURNING FALTERS

One of the objections to burning carbon out of the cylinders about which little is heard is that the process falls to remove the dirt dragged into the engine through the carburetor and breather tube. The carbon will burn but the dirt will not, and it remains to cause trouble that frequently can be avoided only by scraping the pistons.

### COMMON SENSE USEFUL

When driving through a community with whose traffic laws one is unfamiliar, the one certain way to avoid infringement of the regulations is to play absolutely safe. Instead of assuming that the speed limit is 25 miles an hour, estimate that it is 15. Do not puzzle over whether the city permits passing street cars taking on or discharging passengers—stop. Above all, do not count on getting by with a violation of the regulations on the ground of unfamiliarity with the law.

### KEEP CHAIN TIGHTENED

It is not altogether a matter of removing the noise in tightening the timing chain. The intermittent strains on the loose chain are likely to result in breakage.

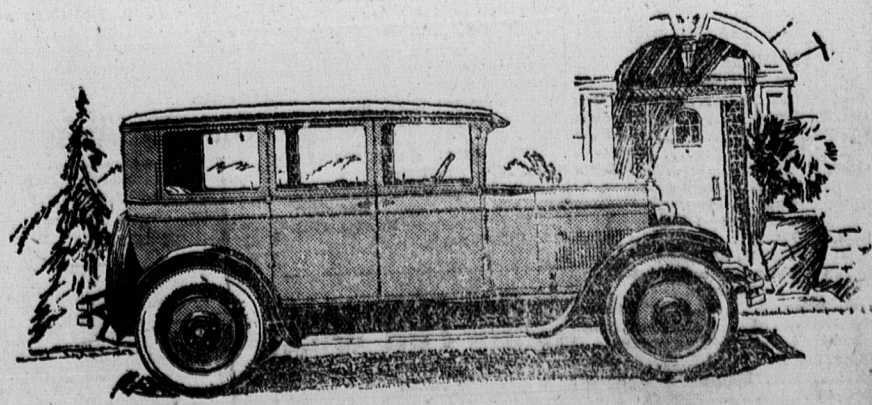
