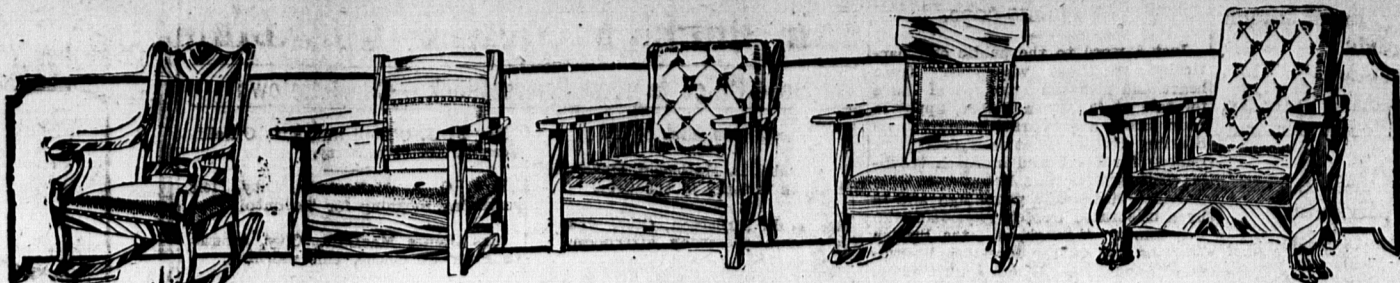
HORSE NOTES.

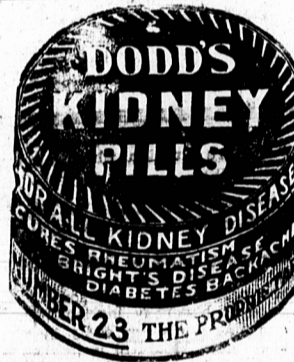
