EDITOR'S MAIL.

SIR.—The Winter Fair in connection with the Maritime Stock Breeders' Association, held here this week, closed last night and I trust that one of the gentlemen present from P. E. I. will give you a full account of it. If our farmers but knew of the information to be obtained from the professors and others sent down here every year from the Department of Agriculture and this (one from Scotland) I am sure many of them would have been present. The lectures given by the different speakers, using living animals for illustration, was most profitable and interesting, an evidence of which was that the large auditorium seating 1000 persons was filled at every session. The prize ring in this part of the building so that everyone desirous could see and hear all going on from a good seat in a warm, light, airy room. Not only were the animals living used in illustration, but they were at once slaughtered, beef animals, hogs and sheep, when the carcasses were again shown and the best points in each fully explained and the advantage of "breeding and feeding," the best and "weeding the inferior." To hear such men as Prof. J. W. Robertson, Dominion Commissioner of Agriculture on improvement of Agriculture; Archibald McVetlage, Editor Scottish Farm, Glasgow. Subject: Canadian Live Stock Products Exported to Great Britain, and Suggestions how to improve that trade, dealing with horses, cattle, sheep and bacon, also dairy products; E. W. Hudson, Dominion Live Stock Commissioner. Subject: Organized effort, dealing with the work of the past year, especially in connection with our Agricultural Associations and Farmers' Institutes. The Dairy Cow by Prof. H. H. D. A., of the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph using the live animal for the purpose of illustration; address by Duncan Anderson, Rugby, Ont., on the Beef Animal using living animals for illustration; Address by J. E. Brethour, on the Bacon hog, using live animals for illustration; Prof. J. H. Grisdale, Agriculturist of Dominion Experimental Farms; Prof. H. H. Dean Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph Subject: "Founding, Maintaining and Care of a Dairy Herd; Talk on Poultry—By Prof. F. C. Hare, The Profitable Breeding Management, and Marketing of Poultry and Eggs, with an Exhibition of plucking and dressing of chickens was a rare treat to me indeed. I could not keep contrasting it with our fall exhibition with its horse racing, side shows, etc. To see such an audience of intelligent farmers and their wives sitting for two hours at a session most attentive listeners and questioners speaks loudly for a change in fall shows and the manner of conducting them.

On account of the fixed dates of the Chicago and Guelph Winter Fairs, ours, for it is inter-provincial, must of necessity be held about the middle of December; The Stanley should be at Summerside to carry exhibitors to Tormentine and scores would surely attend if connection and rates were reasonable. Amherst is only 48 miles from Cape Tormentine so that a round ticket should be within the reach of all.

My object in writing was not to give a description of the Fair but to point out to our farmers that they are being fearfully injured in the purchase of seeds. The Department of Agriculture sent down to twelve different towns and villages in the Maritime Provinces and purchased in each a quantity of red and white clover and timothy seed and had it analyzed. The result just as I give it was put up in a most conspicuous place in the building on a sheet at least six feet square which to mind was most suggestive. Not only this but samples of at least seven kinds of noxious seeds were exhibited which had been culled from the seed purchased. Just think of there being only twenty-seven per cent of pure seed and vital seed in one lot and only forty nine in another. Do not let any person imagine that the seed sold in any other part of the Provinces is any better. These are fair averages of the kind of seed sold in the Maritime Provinces. I cannot suggest a remedy. Can any of your readers?
