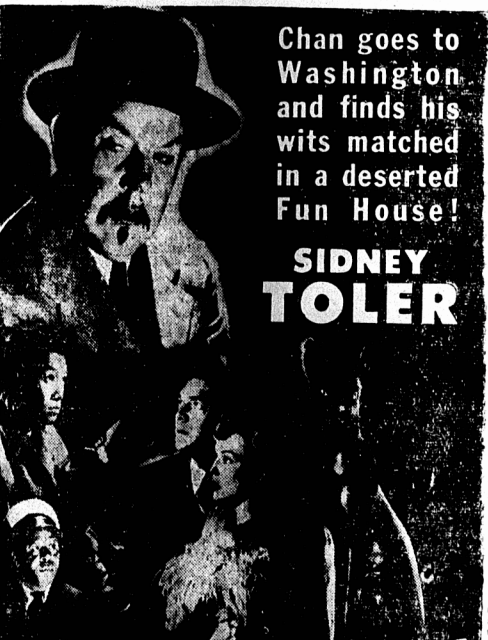

ANCIENT PERU

Peru is the oldest of the South American nations. Scout and assistant Scoutmaster of the 1st Quinmichan Troop a Duncanson, B.C.

Boy Scouts of Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec are to join in a campaign this month, sponsored by the Dept. of Agriculture at Ottawa, to collect milkweed floss to be used in place of kapok in filling life preservers for airmen and seamen. The weed grows in sufficient quantities in the other provinces to conduct campaigns.

Tribute to the part played by the Boy Scouts of Canada in the war effort of the Kinmen Club, was paid at the National Convention of the Clubs of Regina, by the founder, Harold A. Rogers. He mentioned specially aid given in the collection of magazines for the Merchant Marine, and in the Milk for Britain campaign.

Two of the five Canadians awarded the Victoria Cross in this war were former Boy Scouts. The first Canadian to win this coveted distinction was Col. C.C.L. Merritt, for his gallantry at Dieppe where he was taken prisoner. He was a Wolf Cub and Scout in the 6th Vancouver Group. The other Scout to win the V.C. was Major Charles Ferguson Hoy, also of British Columbia. He won it while attached to the Lincolnshire Regiment, in the Imperial Forces fighting in Burma. He had previously won the Military Cross and had been mentioned in despatches. He was a Scout, Rover
