Bear River Soldier Killed In Action

Lawrence Sweeney of Bear River, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. R. Sweeney, was killed in action in Belgium on Oct. 27 last. He was serving with the Canadian Army in Italy, and by a sister, Julia, who is living in Montreal. The following letter was received by Mrs. John H. MacKinnon, Bear River, who adopted Lawrence upon the death of his parents. "It is with sincere regret that I write this letter. It is my sad duty to inform you of the circumstances which resulted in the death of your friend, Pte. Lawrence Sweeney. "In the military operations at the village of Pindorp, Lawrence was instantly killed by shrapnel from a German shell. He had been one of the members of an attack force whose task was to capture the town. "Medical attention reached Lawrence immediately after he was hit but he was killed instantly and there was nothing that could be done. "I realize how useless it is for me to express to you my sincere sympathy. The written word cannot bring back your dearly beloved friend. Perhaps I may be able to increase your pride in him who paid the supreme sacrifice by simply saying that he died a true Canadian. As a soldier he asked for nothing but the right to fight for victory, peace, and a world free from warfare. Those of us who still fight will never forget those who gave their lives for freedom. "May I extend to you, Mrs. MacKinnon, my sincere sympathy at the loss of so gallant a friend." Signed, A. A. GROSSET, Lieutenant.
