#### ONE GOOD POINT ABOUT OVERBIDDING

There is this to be said for rash bidding: without it, every contract might be almost a laydown, and there would be little for bridge columnists to write about! Take today's deal, for example. South's bid was undoubtedly a stretch, but he turned in a competent job in the play and in that way justified himself.

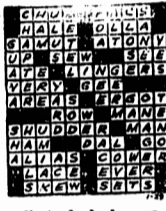

the partners would have lost any laydown slam! South had seven, possibly eight winners; there was no assurance that North could supply five winners. West made what seemed to be the safest, if not the most constructive opening lead, a low trump. South immediately drew the necessary four rounds of trumps, discarding two hearts and one diamond from dummy, then led and passed a club. East won and returned a heart, which South of course won with the ace. Now South led his second club to the ace, ruffed a club, went back to dummy with a diamond to the ace and ruffed away East's last club stopper. Then, with no other good chance for the contract, South took the diamond finesse and was lucky enough to win it. As a small point, but an important one, observe that South's first club lead had to be ducked in dummy, to maintain "communications" between the two hands.

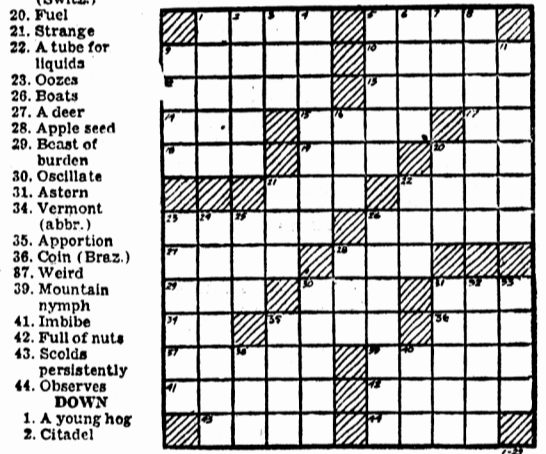
