QUEEN HOTEL FIRE SETTLED.—One of the few outstanding suits against the Queen Hotel Company and John Simon, has been settled out of court for an amount not stated. An order dismissing the action was granted in the Supreme Court Chambers Tuesday by Mr. Justice Carroll on application of E. T. Parker, K.C., solicitor for Mr. Simon. The action was that of Mildred Myrer of Charlottetown, widow of Norman Myrer, and also of Mrs. Myrer as guardian of Patricia and Norma Myrer, infants. Norman E. Myrer was one of the 28 persons who lost their lives in the conflagration that swept the Queen Hotel early in March, 1939. A number of persons who were injured in the catastrophe have brought actions against the company and against Mr. Simon as president of the company, and other suits have been launched by relatives of persons who died in the fire. A few of the latter are still outstanding. —Halifax Star.

'40 Wheat Crop Value Above That of '39, Prospect

OTTAWA, Sept. 25.—(CP)—Prospect for a bumper crop of wheat in 1940 is better than that of 1939, according to an official estimate. That will be only \$3,000,000 better than the value of the 1939 crop, which was 70,000,000 bushels smaller than the estimate crop this year. One certainty is that a bumper crop is being threshed. The last estimate of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics placed the wheat yield of the three Prairie Provinces at 534,000,000.
