REFEREE BEST JUDGE OF FOUL

But Often Not in Position to Judge Exactly Where Blow Landed.

(United Press) NEW YORK, August 8.—Deciding the question of a foul in the prize ring is always a precarious business.

Boxers, from time immemorial, and one of the latest of these is Georges Carpentier, have shown adeptness at taking advantage of technicalities involved in the Marquis of Queensbury rules.

As it stands at present, the referee is the sole judge. If a boxer makes a claim of foul, or if the referee observes a foul blow, he must award the fight to the aggrieved party.

Often, the third man in the ring is not in a position to judge exactly where a blow landed. This was the case when Tunney stopped Carpentier.

It is argued by some that the judges should be polled in an instance like this, since they are so distributed about the ring that one might conceivably have been in a better position to judge the blow in question than was the referee.
