FALL CLEAN-UP TIME IS NOW UPON US

Now, with the tag-end of summer upon us, it's time to have that fall cleaning done. There are curtains to take down—with Junior still around the house to help you—and slip covers to be removed and sent off to the cleaners. HAND CLEANSERS

Use of industrial chemicals and solvents as hand cleansers is frowned upon by authorities of the Department of National Health and Welfare. The department has issued a warning against indiscriminate use of such cleansers as turpentine, gasoline, kerosene, alcohol, acids and alkalis, and has pointed out that the safest cleanser is hot water and a mild soap. The warning is addressed particularly to those in factories.

DRESS TO PLEASE YOUR AUDIENCE

If you're a lady-platformer who cares, you'll think twice about your on-stage dress. An all-black, brown, navy or other monotone costume, according

to the speech counsellors who groom women for the platform, are tiring to an audience. Cook's Corner

PEACH CHIFFON PUDDING

1½ teaspoons granulated gelatine
2 tablespoons water
¾ cup mashed peaches
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
5 tablespoons sugar
2 eggs, separated
¼ teaspoon salt
METHOD: Sprinkle the gelatine over the water and allow to stand for 5 minutes. Add the lemon juice and the grated lemon rind to the mashed peaches. You will need about 2 medium-sized peaches for this. Beat the egg yolks and add to the mashed peaches, along with the 3 tablespoons of the sugar, and then the salt. Cook the mixture over boiling water until thickened, stirring constantly, then add the soaked gelatine and stir until this is dissolved. Cool until slightly thickened. Now beat the egg whites until stiff, but not dry and add the remaining 2 tablespoons sugar to them. Fold the egg whites into the peach mixture. Place the mixture in sherbet glasses and set in the refrigerator until firm, or until ready to serve. Garnish with a custard sauce, if desired.

Gasoline

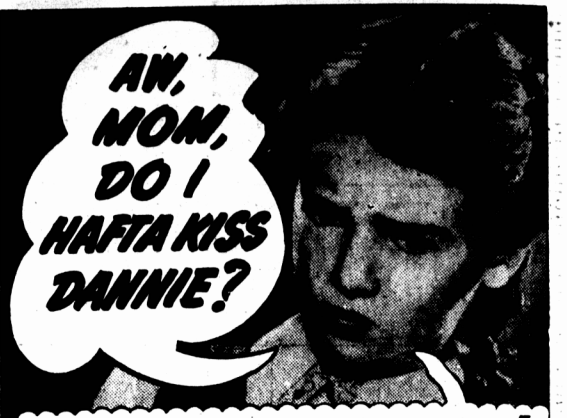
