N. Y. Stock Market Prices Continue Upward Trend

NEW YORK, Aug. 21—(AP)—It was a tight squeeze, but the stock market last week ended higher for the ninth straight week. The net gain was the smallest for any of the nine weeks, and at one time the market was within only a short distance of the 1949 peak. Brokers still think business is on the upgrade now or very shortly will be. The stock exchange last week reported the short interest as of Aug. 15 stood at 2,008,159 shares, the greatest in about 17 cents. Selling stock short means borrowing the stock and then selling it back later at a lower price and thus making a profit. Some observers were alarmed that more stock was sold in expectation of a market decline than at any time in 17 years. In order to make a profit, shorts must buy when prices decline, and when they buy they are creating a demand that cushions the fall of the market. A large short interest is actually looked upon as a sort of insurance against a market break. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks closed at 64.9, a gain of 3 of a point on the week.
