Before leaving Bridgetown members in the congregation called upon Mr. and Mrs. Simpson and presented them with substantial tokens of regard and affection in remembrance of their devoted friends in Bridgetown. Next week another Halifax clergyman, the Rev. John Duxter, will be inducted into the Presbyterian church of Bridgetown, vacated by Rev. Mr. Simpson.—Halifax Exc.
