NOVA SCOTIA HOUSE STIRRED BY SCANDAL

HALIFAX, N. S., May 28.—C. E. Tanner, leader of the Conservative Opposition in the Nova Scotia Legislature read affidavits in the House of Assembly today which put the Government on the defensive and which the Opposition believes will place it in a bad position. The affidavits were from Clarence Mills and Ernest Mills, of the Annapolis lumber firm of A. C. Mills and Sons, Ltd., and they concern Hon. Mr. Daniels, Attorney-General; A. K. MacLean, M. P., and to some extent also Hon. E. H. Armstrong, Commissioner of Public Works and Mines. The affidavits were originally prepared in lawsuit started by the Messrs Mills against Hon. O. T. Daniels. The suit however, having been settled out of court on Mr. Daniels returning to the Mills Brothers a note for \$75,000, given to him as an alleged consideration for putting a timberland deal through but which was never completed. The case involves the release by the Nova Scotia Government of a mortgage held by the Government on 150,000 acres of land, then owned by MacKenzie and Mann's Halifax and South-western Railway Company.

MR. TANNER'S CHARGES.

Mr. Tanner charged that this mortgage was released by legislation introduced by Hon. E. H. Armstrong in order that the deal proposed between Daniels and Mills might be

A mortgage was also given on \$75,000 of the \$150,000 obtained from the railway company and this, said Mr. Tanner, was held by a company organized by A. K. MacLean, M.P. The interest on the \$300,000 was not paid and the deal ended in a middle, but the Opposition now asserts in the House that a great scandal lies at the door of the Nova Scotia Government and particularly of Daniels and MacLean.

Hon. Mr. Armstrong replied to Mr. Tanner denying that there was any wrong doing by the Government and holding that the whole affair had been in the best interests of the province.

Hon. Mr. Daniels followed contending that the Mills note for \$75,000 was simply a gratuity to him and that when the sale failed he had returned it. He denied emphatically that there had been any conclusion whatever or wrong doing of any kind.
