DEAD SEA ODDITIES.

Peculiar Facts Relating to That Ancient Body of Water—Its Geologic History According to Prof. Libbey.

Scientific observation justifies the estimate that a daily average of 6,500,000 tons of water is received into the Dead Sea from the Jordan and other sources during the year. During the rainy season the amount is very much greater; during the dry season it is of course very much less, but this average will be maintained year after year.

This evaporation causes a haze or mist to hang over the lake at all times, and when it is more rapid than usual heavy clouds form and thunderstorms sometimes rage with great violence in the pocket between the cliffs even in the dry season.
