BOUND TO RULE THE WORLD.

Says Rev. Dr. Len G. Broughton of The Anglo-Saxon Race.

Boston, Dec. 12.—The Rev. Dr. Len G. Broughton, pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle at Atlanta, Ga., the largest church in the South, is in Boston as a delegate to the international prophetic conference.

Dr. Broughton is known as the friend of the negro, and has frequently denounced from his pulpit in no unmeasured terms the practice of lynching, and has placed the blame for it upon the Government, which he thinks might have prevented it.

He said to a Herald reporter yesterday that the young, progressive element of the South is more friendly to the colored man than are the New England people. In the first place they have more sympathy with his struggles, and this sympathy is more sincere because of their ultimate daily personal knowledge of the colored man in his weakness. It is the natural sympathy of strength for weakness.

Dr. Broughton said that 99 per cent. of the people of the South are opposed to lynching. "But" he continued, "I believe from what I have seen that the negro's connection with politics is largely to blame for the large amount of lynching."

"For the Anglo-Saxon race is bound to rule the world and nowhere is this race purer than in the South where it has not been mixed with foreigners. It will not be ruled over by any other race. Thus many of the cases of horrible crimes committed by negroes grow out of a spirit of vengeance against the whites having its origin in politics.

"For instance in a community where the negroes were in the majority the taxes increased the schools were poor and there was general misrule. The whites fought against this condition and one awful crime against a woman by a negro was in revenge for this political trouble. When the negro gets into office he intensifies a spirit of hatred against him and this reacts upon himself.

"The remedy? I do not hesitate to say that it will be found in the disfranchise-

ment of the negro. I believe it is the only solution of the problem until he is by the process of education and religious training sufficiently enlightened to intelligently cast his ballot. I believe the low whites should be disfranchised as well. There should be a strong educational test. After disfranchisement, go on with your philanthropy.

"Another reason why the negro should be disfranchised is in order that the white people can be enfranchised. Now we vote the Democratic ticket in the South to keep the negro out of office. So we are not able to act as we would wish on the tariff, or the sound money question, or other national issues.

"I am a Republican, but I can't vote that ticket because we must protect ourselves.

"I believe that to keep the negro separate from the whites socially inspires him to greater efforts, otherwise he would be swamped.

"The southerners do not wish to override the negro. We are willing he should attain to any position except to govern us. Senator McLaurin is really the exponent of the real heart and sentiment of the southern white people today.

"I believe this negro question is a great national problem, and for the safety of our national institutions there must be a solution of it. We should do some national legislation on the matter. Later the younger element of the South will come to the front and take it up in a calmer manner. For this element is really a friend to the negro."

Dr. Broughton was born and educated in North Carolina and has lived in Virginia and Georgia. He spends fully six months of each year travelling and preaching in the southern states. He comes from a long line of slave holders, but says that the abolition of slavery was the best thing possible for the South, which now "blossoms like a rose" under free labor.

THE ADVANCE IN THE COST OF FOOD.

It is costing the average American more for the necessities of life to-day than any time during the last decade and more especially for breakfasts, meats and dairy and garden products.

The fact is, of course, apparent to every house keeper, but even those who keep their accounts most accurately are probably not aware of the great advance that has been made in the last four years.

If the average American had bought his supplies for one year in advance on July 1, 1897, they would have cost him \$72.45, while the same purchases made on Monday would have forced him to pay out \$101.37.

If he had been providing for a household in the days of the civil war and had laid in a year's supply of necessities on January 1, 1860, the cost to him would have been \$121.75.

By 1888, however, the cost of living, figured in this way, had dropped to \$60.90 and gradually fell until the lowest point was reached, on July 1, 1897, when \$72.45 would have been all he needed.

These figures have been compiled by Dun's review. The price records are obtained by multiplying the quotations of 360 of the necessities of life, with allowance for the relative importance of each by the per capita consumption in each case.

It has shown by these figures that there has been an increase of three and seven tenths per cent, since November 1, and of 11 per cent, over December 1.
