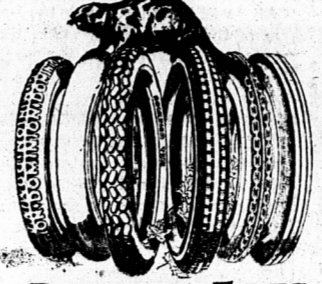
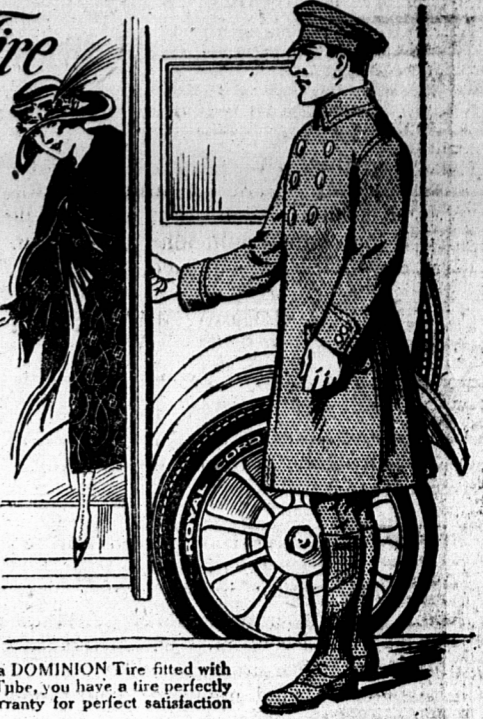
BRITISH MARKET FOR HONEY.—Information reaching the Canadian trade commission from England points to a great demand for honey. Bee-keeping has been very seriously interfered with throughout the British Isles by the inability to get suitable labor during the last three years, and through the extreme restrictions on sugar for winter feeding of bees. It is pointed out that the opportunity for the Canadian production this year will, therefore, be unequalled. Last year's crop in Canada approximated 8,000,000 pounds, and considering the mildness of the winter and the demands which have been made for new hives, it is not unreasonable to expect an increase of five per cent, should the weather in the next few months be fairly good and open. Producers may be assured of good prices.

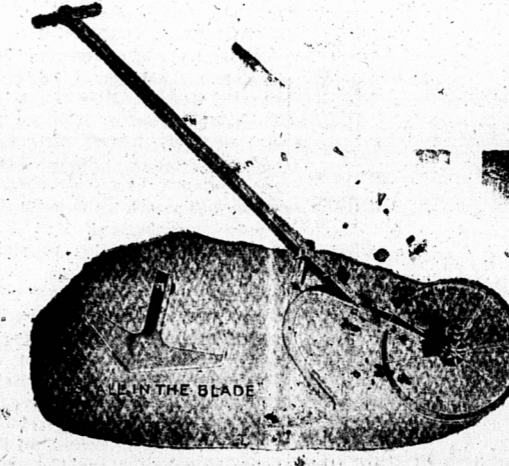

TEXAS GOES DRY  
 DALLAS, Texas, May 27.—Complete returns from more than one-half of the State today showed that the votes of Texas in the elections Saturday probably had adopted amendments to the State constitution to provide prohibition of the liquor traffic, and to extend suffrage to women.  
 The vote was:  
 For prohibition, 51,595; against prohibition, 47,142; for suffrage, 55,158; against suffrage, 51,828.
