The cross, which is on a pilgrimage throughout Europe, will be sent to St. Peter's, across England to Ireland, and then it will be sent to U.S. It has already been carried through Syria, Lebanon, France, Belgium and Italy since beginning of journey on Good Friday in Jerusalem.
