POWER TIRE PUMP INQUIRY



P. L. R. writes: I need a power tire pump on my car, but there seems to be no practical way of placing it, so that it can be driven from the engine.

Answer: For use upon an electrically started car, the crankshaft pump is very convenient. This is a regular, mechanically-driven, piston pump, designed to be carried in the tool box and is fitted with a drive-shaft, adapted to engage with and be driven by the ratchet end of the engine crankshaft.

Answer: Not very much, but somewhat. The added weight of a closed body increases the total load upon the tires and somewhat reduces their mileage if the same size is used as on the open models.

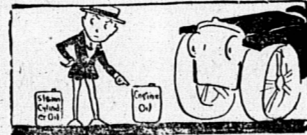
REFRACTORY VALVE CAPS

H. T. asks: How can I remove the valve caps of my engine, so that I can take out the valves to grind them? I cannot start them with a wrench, in the usual way.



Answer: Valve caps, after they have been a long time in place sometimes become "burned in" very firmly. Try slipping a short piece of pipe over the end of your wrench handle, using the free end of the pipe to take hold of, so that you will have a greater leverage.

STEAM CYLINDER OIL FOR GAS ENGINES



M. E. S. writes: I have heard of people mixing a little steam cylinder oil with the regular engine oil to thicken it, so that it will not pass up onto the spark-plugs.

Answer: Steam cylinder oil would thicken the mixture, when the engine was cold, but would not do so when it was fully warmed up.

When an engine becomes overheated, it usually begins to knock and the sudden commencement of such noises is often the first sign that the cooling system is not doing its duty.
