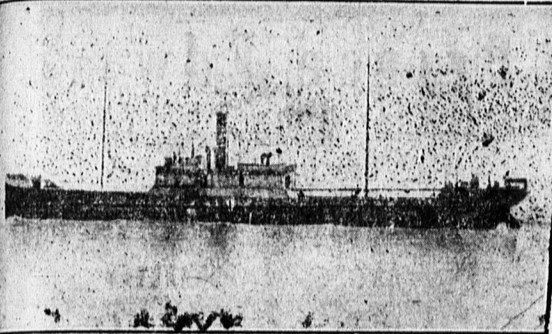

**DREDGING DOCK.**—Dredge No. 9, of the Dominion Department of Public Works, began work yesterday at dredging out the dock at the foot of Queen St. It is the intention of Messrs. Buntain Bell & Co. to enlarge their wharf and for this purpose a large part of the dock nearest their office is being filled in, which will give an additional space of forty feet across. The dredge is picking up a large quantity of material which fell into the dock last season as a result of dredging being carried on too close to the pier. The dock will be still further deepened and when this is completed, the dredge will begin the work of deepening the dock on the east side, between Messrs. Buntain & Bell's wharf and the Marine wharf.

**NEW FLOUR MILLS.**—Work was started yesterday at excavating for the collar of the new flour mills to be erected in Charlottetown. The mill will be situated on Felling street near the Condensed Milk Factory, adjacent to the Railway line, and it is expected to have it running by August 15th. The mill will have a capacity of 100 bbls. a day to start with. It is the intention to have a Railway siding laid where all cars may be loaded and unloaded. The machinery for the mills has arrived. It was purchased from the Fairbanks-Morse Co., and is the most up-to-date machinery of the kind. The authorized capital of the company is \$35,000 and the paid-up capital is \$21,000.

The pigeon is not a captive but follows the ship wherever it goes. It is quite tame, and a native of the South. It looks very much the same as the ordinary Canadian pigeon, though not quite so large as the average.

**TAX ON SHOES REDUCED.** Word was received on Saturday, the tax on shoes has been reduced. All shoes up to and including nine dollars are tax free over that amount the tax is fifteen per cent. on the excess. For example, ten dollar shoes are taxed only fifteen cents, eleven dollar shoes thirty cents, twelve dollar shoes only forty-five cents. This is much less than the original idea, and no doubt will be much appreciated by shoe buyers.

**A SPLENDID CAR.**—Mr. James C. Tuplin of Alberton, was in the city yesterday to take delivery of his handsome new McLaughlin Buick Sedan, which has just arrived from the factory. This is a car of exceptional beauty, and is the only one of its kind in this province. The four forward windows are of bevelled plate glass, which all raise and lower by the turning of a nickelled crank. The centre of the car inside contains a handsome electric dome light which illuminates the whole interior. The interior upholstery is of superior whipcord. The doors are self-locking, which is a great boon and is a safeguard against theft. The car was purchased through the agency of Mr. J. Stanley Wedlock and cost \$4,000.

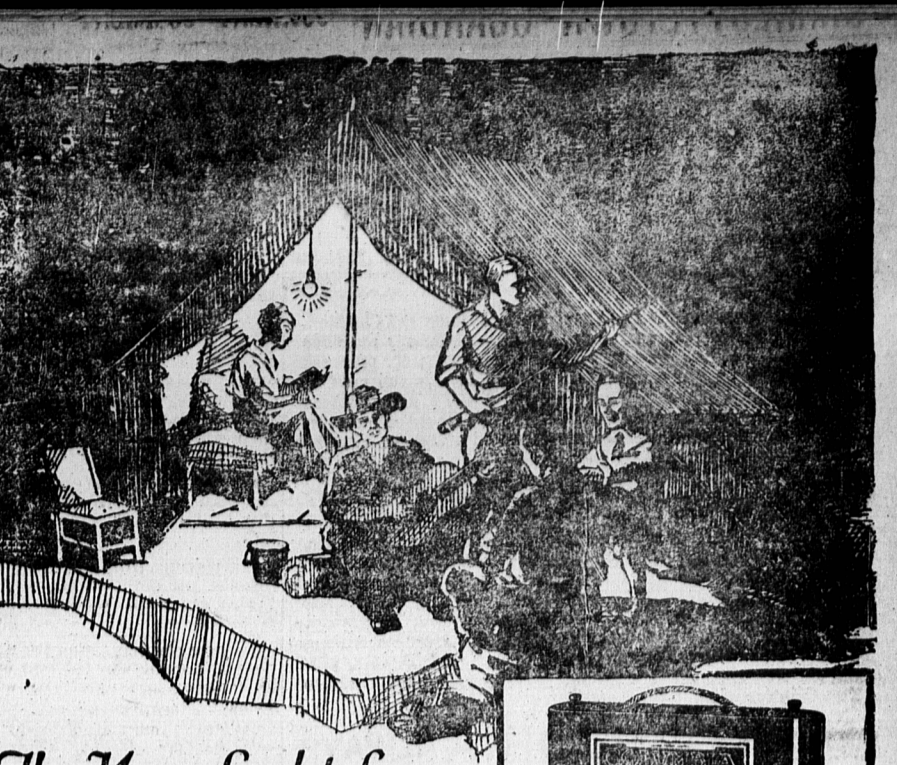
