Candidates In P. E. I. Election Ready For Fray

When the Liberal Government of the Hon. Walter M. Lea goes to the country on Thursday, August 6, it will face a full array of Conservative opposition candidates under the leadership of Hon. J. D. Stewart, K.C., a former premier of Prince Edward Island.

Unlike the legislature of any of her sister provinces, membership in the Prince Edward Island House is composed of two classifications, evenly divided, a legacy of the old bi-cameral system.

The outgoing house was chosen at the general election held June 25, 1927, the result bringing about the defeat of the Conservative Government led by Hon. J. D. Stewart, K.C., who had appealed to the people on a policy of government control of the sale of liquor.

Following is the list of candidates in the field, with party affiliation and previous political experience, if any, indicated. It will not be known until Nomination Day who will run as Councillors and who as Assemblymen.
