MERRY CHRISTMAS

Their Excellencies the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire left Ottawa Wednesday on a special train for Halifax, where they will visit the hospitals and take steps to help the sufferers in the city of the great disaster.

An historic event was celebrated in London last Saturday afternoon when a choral commemoration of the first seven divisions of men of the old British army, who, at great sacrifice and against tremendous odds, stemmed the German tide in 1914, was held in Albert Hall. Their majesties were present, also several hundred survivors of the old army, many of whom had been wounded. These marched in procession along the Albert embankment, after being entertained at lunch by the lord mayor. The hall itself was filled to the utmost. Besides their majesties there were also present the Princesses Mary, Alice and Victoria, Prince Arthur of Connaught, and Princess Patricia, Princess Beatrice, Queen Alexandra, many members of the government and members of parliament.

Lieut. Ronald Stewart's friends are welcoming him home from Toronto for the Christmas holidays.

Lady Byng may now well be the proudest woman in England. Her husband, Sir Julian Hedworth Byng, commanded the British Third Army in its great drive on Cambrai and has been promoted to full general in recognition of his services. Lady Byng is well known in England as a novelist. She is the only child of Sir Richard Moreton.

Miss Barrett's Kindergarten closing on Thursday was a happy event for the little folks and a pleasure to the parents who were quite proudly entertained by their children.

Canon Simpson received many warm congratulations this week as he enters his 32nd year of his pastorate in St. Peter's Cathedral. The well wishes of the entire Province are extended to Canon Simpson for many years of continued health and happiness.

Within a fortnight Mrs. Bernhardt, who has fared well in the South-West, will leave the United States for the first visit that she has ever paid to Central America. There she will act for ten weeks, returning through Porto Rico and Cuba.
