A WAR IN CHRISTIAN SCIENCE.

The "mother church" of Christian Science, located in Boston, has disciplined Mrs Stetson of the First Church of Christian Science in New York. This First Church edifice is considered to be not only one of the finest buildings devoted to the promotion of the religious cult affected, but its congregation as being, in many respects, the most important of the many in the country. The beautiful church was built largely through the efforts of Mrs Augusta E. Stetson, and she exercised in the congregation a leadership which was powerful. She was a preacher until such time as preaching was abolished in Christian Science churches, and a reader and a practitioner for the cure of physical and mental troubles until she was disciplined by the mother church and her license revoked.

Out of the middle finally have come the reasons for the summary acts. It is alleged from Boston that Mrs Stetson and her followers have been teaching doctrines which are in opposition to the teachings of "Science and Health," the book of Mrs Mary Baker Eddy, which book, next to the Bible, is the sacred book of the Scientists. It is alleged that Mrs Stetson and her followers have been exercising mental control in a lawful way. The Mrs Eddy book distinctly in veighs against the use of the hypnotic power and the use of mental control or concentration for anything but beneficent and uplifting purposes. Mrs Stetson is charged with the use of the power in the opposite way, and with teachings that the real truths of Christian Science are to be found only in the teachings of the First Church in New York. One of her heresies is alleged to be that she has taught young girls that it is wrong to marry.

A good row seems to be on. The courts are to be appealed to and the whole matter is to be thrashed out in litigation. And, overshadowing all is, apparently, impending a schism in the Church of Christ, remarks an onlooker. It is the beginning of the end of a school which for years has been the wonder of the students of the religious psychology?

It is not generally known that Garibaldi's legal widow is still living, although the Italian liberator himself died some thirty years ago. She is the daughter of the Marquis Raimondi, the friend of Mazzini, and she first attracted the attention of Garibaldi by riding into his camp on the evening before the battle of Varese with important information on the position of the enemy. The lady is now nearly eighty years of age, and she has lately stated that she was forced to marry with Garibaldi to satisfy the ambitions of her father. The marriage has since been happily married, and still bears traces of her early beauty, while preserving unimpaired her mental brilliance and the memory of the great events in which she bore a part.

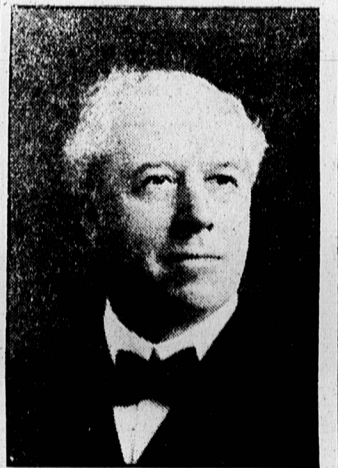

Woman's real rights are those that are the Lord's work, of being the life giver, of keeping a happy corner where the weary can rest, of keeping men, who naturally relapse into barbarism when left too much alone, equal to more delicate harmonies of life."
