### HOME CURED MEATS.

A Missouri housewife recently wrote to the College of Agriculture at Columbia making the following inquiry: "I would appreciate very much any advice you can give me on what is the best thing I can do to keep our Summer hams. We kept them in salt until thoroughly salted then hung them up to dry and smoked. Now they are moulding."

Y. F. Towbridge of the Department of Agricultural Chemistry, in replying said: "It should be emphasized that mould does not spoil cured meats. Some persons purchasing country cured hams insist that the mould should be left on as a proof that the meat is genuine country cured meat. Some recommend dipping the meat in boiling water to stop the moulding. This is only temporary, as the mould will start to grow again if the damp weather continues."

"In prolonged season of wet, muggy weather, cured meats are certain to mould. This moulding of cured meat can be checked by hanging the meat where there is a good circulation of air. Cured meats should never be hung in a damp basement. If the smoke house is tight enough to keep out the skinner fly so that the meat is left hanging in the smoke house a smudge built every week during the damp weather helps keep down the mould. Sacking of meats does not stop the moulding. If meats are wrapped tight to keep out the weevils the wrappings should be done first with cloth and then with paper. If paper is used first it will stick badly to the meat after it moulds. We find it a very good practice to encase the meat in a paper flour sack, tying the neck of the sack very tightly around the string in which the meat hangs. The meat is then hung so that the pieces do not touch each other."

### THE ART OF LACING A CORSET

Not one woman in 20 wears her corsets correctly and the reason we hear so many complaints about their discomfort.

The usual way is to lace them up to the required size once and for all, and let them stay like that until they are worn out, or the lace breaks, but the proper way is to adjust it each time of wearing.

You must have a very long lace—not shorter than eight yards; but if you can't get one so long two or four yards may be tied together. Start at the top and lace through the holes until you reach the waist. Then make a loop at each side by passing each end back through the next hole below on the same side. Then continue lacing until half way between the waist line and the bottom of the corset.

Make two loops as before, and continue the lacing to the bottom, where the ends must be tied.

Before you put on the corsets, see that the lace is drawn as loosely as possible. Place the corsets round the figure very low down and fasten the lowest hook. Next fasten the top hook, unfasten the bottom one, and fasten each in turn from the top to the bottom.

Fasten the front garters to the stockings at the inside of each knee, the side garters to the side of the stockings, and the back garters to the seat at the back. All this time the corsets will quite fasten round the figure. Now take hold of the upper part of the combinations and pull them up well.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

November 14, 1915

### DANIEL IN THE KING'S COURT

(World's Temperance Sunday)

#### GOLDEN TEXT

"Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong."—1. Corinthians 16.13.

Lesson—Daniel 1: verse 8-16, 19, 20 printed. Memorize verse 15.

How Daniel Came to Babylon. For our World's Temperance Sunday Lesson we study the first chapter of the Book of Daniel. It was at the fall of Samaria, in the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim, King of Judah (606 B. C.) that Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon, besieged Jerusalem, and carried back with him to Babylon some of the treasures of the Temple, and some Jewish captives. There he directed one of his officers, the Nebuchadnezzar, to take the Jewish youths of noble blood who were especially fair and bright, and have them taught the languages and learning of the Chaldeans for three years, and thus educated for his service. Four of these boys were Daniel, Hananiah, Michael and Azariah, to whom were given the Chaldean names of Belteshazzar Shadrack, Meshach and Abed-nego.

The scene of our lesson is in the royal palace at Babylon, when this city was the height of its glory under Nebuchadnezzar. Is it not wonderful that the temple of Nebuchadnezzar has recently been unearthed, and men living in the twentieth century after Christ can walk over the pavement on which Daniel walked seven centuries before? The scene of our lesson is in the site of Babylon by the floods from the river covered it in places to a depth of fifty feet, till German archaeologists carefully dug through to the foundations of the ancient city. Each brick in Nebuchadnezzar's palace is stamped with his name and royal titles in cuneiform script. The throne hall is an immense room, and the intricacy of the passages, rooms, courts is said to be almost bewildering. In a great pile of debris many inscriptions have been found, among them this statement: "I thought to build up to Heaven." We know that the huge walls of the city were over a hundred feet high, that the "Hanging Gardens" were one of the Seven Wonders of the ancient world, that the huge temple of Bel was grander than any of the other ancient temples.

Daniel is thought to have been fourteen years old when he made his firm resolve. He purposed in his heart, and he continued true to that purpose. His self-mastery in youth was the keynote of his material life. The time to form such a purpose of being true to principle and loyal to God is in youth.

#### Quit You Like Men, Be Strong

Daniel's Firm Stand. These boys, Daniel and his companions, must have been about fourteen years old at this time, but they certainly did quit themselves like strong, true men. They remained true to their convictions of right, steadfast in their allegiance to Jehovah, under circumstances which might have seemed to excuse a contrary course. How easily they might have argued that in that foreign court they must do as they were bid, that it would be useless to refuse the king's food, that they could only yield to the inevitable!

The question which was to these lads a matter of conscience was in regard to a ceremonial rule. They believed it a sacred duty to keep this rule, and therefore not to have kept it would have been for them a sin. It is evild for that man who eateth with offence, said Paul. The principle at stake, too, was greater than the keeping of one law alone. The king had changed not only their food but their dress, their studies, their very names. Daniel meant "God is my judge," his new name, Belteshazzar, meant "May heils" (a Babylonian goddess) defend the king." Everything was done to make these youths forget their nationality and their religion. Had they yielded in the matter of eating meat sacrificed to idols, they would have been renouncing Jehovah their God for the false gods of Babylon.

As regards the ceremonial defilement days in these days, said Paul, who says, "I am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean of itself," but we may well profit by the splendid example of fidelity to principle given by these lads.

The Heroism God Asks of All Boys and Girls. Every one of you will at some time or other be called upon to show courage and heroism, in having to say, when heroism demands a very simple word distinctly and very decisively—the word "No." How much wretchedness and ruin have been brought into the homes and hearts of men and women, and of boys and girls, because they said it in a half-hearted way, so that it sounded very much like "Yes," and in the end was really turned into "Yes." Learn early to guard yourselves against evil companionship and evil example, and when the temptation comes to you, as come it will, to sin against God's law, and in matters of truthfulness, or of honesty; or of purity, or of love and gentleness—the moment your conscience whispers "No," let your lips take up the message and proclaim aloud, clearly as with trumpet notes, "No." Does this seem to you but a mild and weakly form of heroism? It is just what God expects of you, because it is within the range of your powers. Do not underestimate what you can do, as boys and girls, because it appears to you little in comparison with what you have heard of the world's renowned heroes and heroines of truthfulness, or of what we can do. He asks of us not according to his measure, but according to our measure.—Simson Singer, in "Sermons to Children."

## WHAT CANADA PAYS!

### SOLDIERS PAY AND ALLOWANCES, CONDITIONS OF ENLISTMENT PROVISION FOR WIVES, MOTHERS AND CHILDREN

Canada is determined that her sons shall be as well paid and their families as well cared for, as a grateful and wealthy country can afford. The scale of pay for Overseas Service, the allowances from the Patriotic Fund, and the Pensions, are on a more liberal basis than those of any other country engaged in the war.

#### SCALE OF PAY

RANK	Pay per day	Field Allowance per day	Separation Allowance per month
Sergeants.....	\$1.95	\$0.15	\$25.00
Corporals.....	1.10	.10	20.00
Privates, Buglers, Drummers etc.....	1.00	.10	20.00

The men are, of course, fed and clothed by the Government. The Separation Allowance is the sum paid by the Government to the wife of each enlisted man, or to the widowed mother if the son is unmarried and is her sole support. This is in addition to part of his pay which is reserved for her. One-half of a soldier's pay is withheld by the Government and paid to his dependents. This ensures that at least \$35.00 per month is paid by the Government to the wife of each soldier.

### THE PATROTIC FUND

The Patriotic Fund has been created to assist those dependents of a soldier who need more help than the Government gives. From this Fund the following sums are paid if the need exists:—

Wives.....	From \$5.00 to \$10.00 per month
Children of widowers.....	
Mothers of unmarried men.....	
Children of married men according to age and number in family.....	\$1.50 to \$6.00 each per month

Ladies representing the Patriotic Fund pay regular visits to families of men on Overseas Service, and give friendly advice and practical help in case of need. Many employers have pledged themselves to give preference to returned soldiers when engaging men.

### PENSIONS

The Canadian scale of pensions range for private soldier, from \$75.00 per year for certain minor injuries to \$264.00 for total disability. In case of death \$22.00 a month is paid to the widow, and \$5.00 a month for each child. A widowed mother whose son was her whole support receives \$22.00 a month.
