MONTREAL FIRE LOSS \$55,000

Five Firms Suffer Loss and Two men Seriously Injured.

MONTREAL, July 6.—(Special)—About \$55,000 damage was done by fire on Cote Street early this morning, the following firms suffering loss: Desbarats & Co., engravers. B Plow Co., bookbinders; Smith & McKewen, shirt manufacturers; Soot & Hayward, printers. J E Holdsworth, cloth finishing and spanging work. One fireman and one electric lineman were seriously injured.

A BELLEVILLE LAWYER KILLED

By Falling Down Stairs—Prominent in Legal and Social Circles.

BELLEVILLE, Ont., July 6.—(Special)—W J McCamion, a prominent lawyer and society man was found dead at three o'clock at the bottom of a flight of stairs in rear of a business block. His neck was broken and his face badly cut and covered with blood. It is supposed he tripped on the stairs and fell to the bottom. He was prominent in legal circles being for several years Grand Master of the Chosen Friends and high in many other societies. He leaves a widow.

THE RELIEF FUND FOR JAPANESE

OTTAWA, July 6.—Canada's contribution to the Japanese Relief Fund reached the splendid total of over \$70,000. The following sums passed through the hands of Hon. T. Nösse, Japanese Consul General at Ottawa:— \$12,554.45 Through the "Halifax Herald," Halifax, N. S. \$11,410.10 Through the "Toronto Star," Toronto. \$ 6,900.00 Through Subscribers to the "Christian Guardian" Toronto. \$ 2,510.32 Through the Ontario Sunday School Association, Toronto. \$ 2,035.34 Through the Ottawa Committee, Japanese Relief Fund, Ottawa. \$1,708.23 Through the Montreal Board of Trade, Montreal. \$ 950.10 Through the Presbyterian Churches in Canada, Toronto. \$ 577.41 Through the Charlottetown Guardian, P. E. I. \$ 500.00 Lake of the Woods Milling Company, Ltd., Montreal. \$ 186.00 Through the Mayor of Oxford, N. S. \$ 150.00 From the townspeople of Woodstock, N. B. \$ 482.02 From various sources. \$10,030.07. The Dominion Parliament contributed \$10,000 to the value of \$25,000. In addition to the foregoing amounts \$1,000, the first subscribed by the people of Nova Scotia, through the Halifax Herald, was sent to Tokio to the British Ambassador and by him handed to the Japanese Central Relief Committee. Over \$4,000 was contributed by both Japanese and Canadians in British Columbia and forwarded by the Consul at Vancouver, Mr. Morikawa. Minard's Liniment Relieves Neuralgia.

BOURASSA TELLS OF INDEMNITIES

OTTAWA, July 5.—The question of indemnity was discussed in the house this evening. An amendment was made providing for reasonable living expenses to members and senators when travelling to and from Ottawa to attend the session. This was necessary because the auditor held that the act now only covered Pullman and stage fare. To those who lived 400 miles from Ottawa they could, instead of living expenses, get \$15 per day one trip each way between his residence and Ottawa each session. Mr. Bourassa gave an illustration of how the present rule worked as to attendance of senators and members. Last session he said, lasted 101 days. The actual earnings were 120 days. This gave an allowance of \$22 per day. The senate sat for 68 days. If a senator attended 43 days there were no deductions. He gave the following list of a few senators. Senators, Days present, Per Day. Kiroff 44 \$55. Sheyn 43 67. MacKeen 38 82.

CANADA'S GREAT REVENUE SHOWS LARGE INCREASE

Over Last Year in Customs, Excise, Post Office and Railways in Very Gratifying Figures—Sunday Observance Bill is Further Discussed and Amended to But a Shadow of its Former Self—Some Amendments Voted Down.

OTTAWA, July 6.—(Special)—The financial statement for last fiscal year shows Canada's revenue to have been over seventy-eight million dollars, an increase of eight million six hundred thousand over last year. Returns of expenditure to July first are fifty-four millions. Customs receipts show an increase of nearly five millions and Excise an increase of one million and a half; Post Office increase nearly eight hundred thousand; Public Works and Railways over eight hundred thousand. Practically the whole time of the House was spent today licking the Sunday Observance Bill into shape. Many amendments were offered and several accepted until the Bill was only a shadow of its former self. In the morning an amendment was carried declaring it not unlawful work to save life and property. Another which provides that the compulsory 24 hours rest should not apply to men regularly employed eight hours daily, was passed after a sharp debate. Thomas Martin moved an amendment forbidding any member of a club or association where an annual or other fee was charged, to play golf or cricket or any other game on the club grounds on Sunday, or to be present there. This was carried 2 to 42, all the ministers voting against it. Later the Government whips got to work and when the amendment was read in committee for concurrence it was cut out. The House rejected an amendment by Mr Bourassa to prevent the use on Sunday for beverage of alcoholic liquor in railway or tramway cars, steamboats or any public place.

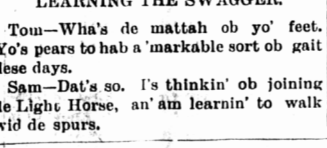

A recent issue of The Hatchet contained a lecture to young men and boys, in which Mrs Nation used plain language.

So ends this life."

BEAUTIFYING HALIFAX EXHIBITION GROUNDS FOR THE DOMINION FAIR

The appearance of the Nova Scotia Exhibition Grounds at Halifax is being revolutionized by gangs of men who are getting them into shape for the Dominion Exhibition, and those who have been coming to the Provincial Shows in past years will hardly recognize the old grounds as they appear in use by the great Dominion Exhibition. The area enclosed by the half-mile track has been levelled off, grass seed sown, small buildings removed and a new vaudeville stage erected, with dressing rooms beneath. Workmen are engaged doubling the floor space of the main building and making important changes and improvements in Machinery Hall. Alterations, extensions and repairs are being effected on all sides within the immense enclosure. The Exhibition Commission would urge on the farmers and live-stock men of the Maritime Provinces the importance of at once taking steps to have a creditable exhibit in their particular departments. We must see to it that Nova Scotia and all the rich eastern provinces stand out well in comparison with Ontario, Quebec, and other parts of the Dominion that will be represented at the Dominion Exhibition SEPTEMBER 22ND to OCTOBER 5th.
