NATURAL HISTORY

Society Picnic at St. Peter's Island.

A most enjoyable day was spent in search of specimens botanical and geological. Naturally the locality afforded more attractions in the latter department of natural science, and we hear that a very valuable specimen was secured for the prospective museum of this popular society in the form of the petrified remains of what is considered by the knowing ones of the society as the partial remains of an ancient saurian in petrified form. The attendance was not as large as that of last year but was fully up to the standard of previous anniversaries.

One party of ladies made the circuit of the island. Starting at a point on the shore they wandered now on the sand and now on the rocks, arriving two hours later where they started. A STAGE COLLAPSES.

And a Little Boy Receives Painful Injuries.—A Narrow Escape.

What might have been a fatal accident happened at St. Peter's Island on Saturday. Wellington, the seven year old son of the late Mr. Wm. Houston, had gone to the landing-stage of the Portland Packing Company with refreshments for his elder brother, and was standing with John Stewart, engineer of the steamer Southport, (which had carried the Natural History Society party to the Island,) and Robert Lund on the frail wooden erection, when it suddenly collapsed. Stewart escaped with a few scratches. Lund had his ankle slightly sprained, but the boy received painful injuries which might have been fatal. Considering the fact that over twenty cases of lobsters and a number of lobster traps were precipitated with the unfortunates upon a rocky shore from an elevation of over ten feet, it is simply marvelous that more serious results did not follow. At it was the Houston boy was badly bruised and as he was suffering much pain after being removed to his home, Mr. Watson the Secretary of the National History Society was asked to examine his injuries, with the result that it was decided that he be conveyed to the city in the Southport by surgical treatment. Dr. Jenkins was sent for and found the little fellow's right leg broken above the ankle. After the injured limb had been attended to the patient was removed to the house of friends where he will be cared for until he may return to his home. We learn that the little patient behaved bravely throughout the painful incidents of the accident, his removal to his home, his conveyance to the city and the consequent operation.

SEYMOUR'S DANGER

No Tidings From Relief Expedition

TIENTSIN BOMBARDED

Peril to Foreigners—Japanese Troops Expected—Trouble Spreading

BRITISH SETTLEMENTS DESTROYED.

SHANGHAI, June 23.—(Special).—The bombardment of Tien Tsin continues and it is believed most of the foreign concessions have been destroyed, including the entire British settlements.

Missionaries from all parts are flocking here and the belief now is that this city will be attacked.

NO WORD FROM SEYMOUR—AMERICANS KILLED.

No word has been received of Admiral Seymour's expedition. The American Consulate at Tien Tsin has been destroyed and several Americans killed.

THE FIGHT AT TIEN TSIN.

It is now definitely known that Chinese forces, not Boxers, are fighting at Tien Tsin and American troops are taking an active part with other foreign powers. Several thousand Japanese troops are hourly expected.

PRINCE LUNN'S SEYMOUR'S PERIL.

Prince Lunn is leading the Chinese forces in the bombardment of Tien Tsin and apparently the whole Chinese army is being employed on behalf of the Boxers, so that the relief expedition is in a perilous position, surrounded by hordes of well-armed troops, and it is feared it has fared badly.

AMERICAN TROOPS DELAYED.

The foreign force at Tien Tsin is badly off for ammunition. The situation is very critical.

The start of the American troops from the Philippines is delayed by a storm Wednesday next.

It is believed the powers will seize all the Chinese forts along the coast at once.
