An enthusiastic meeting of young men was held last night in the lower room of the Y. M. C. A. when a debating society was organized. The society will meet regularly once a week during the winter and object of meeting will be for the development mentally and physically. The officers for the year were elected, also a strong executive and a committee appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws to be submitted at the next meeting which will be on Tuesday 9th January at 8 p. m. All members are requested to be prompt in attendance. The society is open to all young men who wish to avail themselves of this opportunity of cultivating their minds and bodies in a pleasant and profitable manner. Literary and musical meetings will also be held.

FROM a private letter received in the city, from Mr. W. D. McKay, dated Dawson City, October 20th, it is learned that Mrs. McKay and Miss Louise arrived there on October 15th. The letter states that Mr. McKay had rented a house 16x21 feet with a board partition in the middle, for the purpose of the price of provisions, flour is quoted at \$22.00 a barrel; potatoes 40 cents a lb; lamb chop 65 cents a lb; beef steak \$1.50 lb; carpet tacks 25 cents a package, etc.; of the same quality as is sold in Charlottetown for 8 cents, is sold for 80 cents. In referring to hotel accommodation the letter says that living in an ordinary hotel is very high and that they paid \$1.00 a day for a room at the McDonald House. Mr. McKay was expected to arrive on the following Sunday with his outfit. According to the letter there is no truth in the statement of Mr. McKay's loss.
