### PEARY IS SUEED BY COOK'S PARTNER.

BERLIN, June 10 — Rudolph Francke, who was associated with Dr. Frederick A. Cook in Arctic exploration, has brought suit against Commander Robert E. Peary in the sum of \$10,000. This amount is estimated as half the value of furs and walrus and narwhal teeth which Francke bought from natives in the Arctic regions upon arrangement with Dr. Cook that they should share them half and half.

According to Francke's statements, Commander Peary found him seriously ill at Etah, owing to a fall on a glacier, and took advantage of this circumstance to demand the entire collection as the price of transporting him to America. Francke claims that he did not act of his own free will, but by compulsion, and says that Peary set aside a part of the Roosevelt to present to ex-President

The papers in the suit were served on Commander Peary at a hotel this evening. He refused to take them when they were handed to him by a deputy, and the officer then laid them on a table in the presence of a witness, calling the commander's attention to the fact that this was a legal service.

Earlier in the day, when the report of a court action was being noised about, the commander sought out the American Ambassador, David Jayne Hill, and submitted the case to him. He declared later that he left the matter in the ambassador's hands and had washed his hands of the whole affair. He declined to make any statement with reference to the suit.

### A PLANT THAT QUENCHES THIRST.

Strangers left alone in the desert often die; native animals and native races do not. This comes of knowledge or the lack of it. For the native animals and men know what the stranger knows not—that there is water in all deserts, and that the receptacles for this water are plants which, by means of their roots, absorb water from the soil when the rains come and store it up, like reservoirs, for use in the time of drought. The methods by which this absorption is carried on are, in many cases, wonderful. Equally so are the methods by which nature works to make the plants retain water after it has been absorbed. An examination with the microscope shows that this is done, but it is enough here to say that the interior of a plant that holds water consists of myriad water

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the head of a family or any male over 18 years old may have a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, daughter, brother or sister of intending home steader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homestead may be within nine miles of his homestead on an arm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his wife, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may take a purchased home-land in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years from date of purchase and erect a house worth \$500.00.

storage cells. The amount of water, moreover, which such a plant as the cactus we are describing, holds in its interior is extraordinary. A determination of the water in a sample of its storage tissue has shown over 96 per cent.

The common name of this varitable "spring of the desert" is the barrel cactus, or bisnaga (Echinocactus Emoryi), one specimen of which is recently kept in the conservatory of the Department of Agriculture at Washington, weighed 170 pounds. A specimen weighing one ton and measuring 9 feet high and 3 feet in diameter was once received at Kew, but soon died, owing to injuries in transit.

Some years ago, when Frederick V. Coville of the Department of Agriculture at Washington, in company with D. T. MacDougal of the New York Botanical Garden, was in Mexico seeking a location for a desert botanical laboratory for the Carnegie Institution of Washington, he made a special study of the barrel cactus. The locality in which these investigations took place was in the state of Sonora, Mexico, about eight miles from the railway station of Torres, a region in which the bisnaga abounds.

Happily for the investigations, there was at hand, in the person of Mr. Coville's guide—an intelligent Papago Indian—one who from old-time practice was able to show how deftly and quickly the traveler in the desert may quench his thirst. He first picked out a cactus a little over 3 feet high and 20 inches in diameter. He then sliced off the top and exposed the white interior, raising the top from the rest of the plant as if it were a lid on hinges. Inside could be seen a pulpy structure, evidently saturated with water, although it was noticeable that the water did not exude from the pulp when the cut was made. The guide then cut a stake about 3 inches in diameter at the blunt end, and began to mash the flesh of the cactus into a pulp. By this means he made in the top of the cactus a sort of bowl, and soon had collected a suitable quantity of this pulp. Then taking it up in his hands he squeezed out the water into the bowl and tossed the useless pulp away. The flavor of the water was slightly saltish.—Strand Magazine.

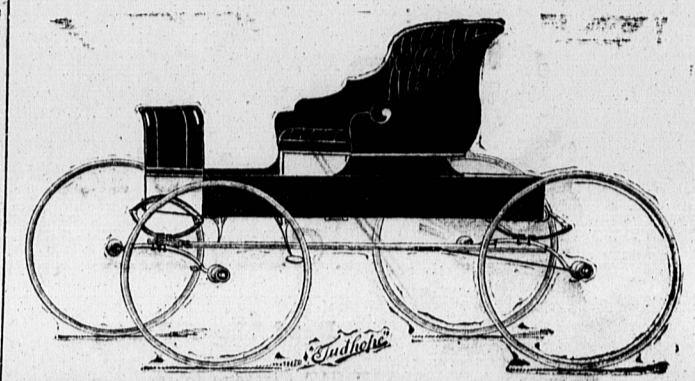
